Northam detectives have charged a man in relation to an incident that occurred on Wednesday, 14 June 2023 in Northam.

It will be alleged, about 8.05am, the man - in the company of another unknown man - set fire to a Kia Ultima on Hampton Street.

In setting fire to the vehicle, the unknown became alight. He ran from the address and into the Avon River, opposite Broome Terrace, before both men left the area in a Holden Adventra.

Upcoming sewer relining work in Meckering



What is happening?

Our authorised contractor Allpipe, will soon commence work to refurbish ageing wastewater pipes in Meckering. Sewer relining uses trenchless technology to clean and refurbish existing wastewater pipes. It reduces the likelihood of blockages and extends the life of this important infrastructure by at least 30 years.

Where is this happening?

We will be working across the town of Meckering. Please reference the map on the following page for an overview of the work areas. For more information, including aerial maps with street names, visit watercorporation.com.au/sewerrelining

When is this happening?

Work is scheduled to commence in earlyJune 2023 and completed by late July 2023. During this period, we will generally work from Monday to Saturday between 7.00 am and 5.00 pm. Night works may occasionally be required, and in this case we will notify impacted residents in advance.

How will this impact me?

Allpipe will be working in both verges and/or roads, and also in the boundary of private properties. If Allpipe requires access to your property, we will contact you directly to discuss the work and arrange entry.

Residents and businesses may notice more activity in the area, noise from generators and vehicles and temporary odour. Traffic management will be in place to direct vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians safely around the work area.


If you experience any odour in your bathroom during this work, flush your toilet and pour water down the floor drain.

Where possible, please keep all toilet lids closed during this period. If water spurts from your toilet, please notify Courtney Hiller from Allpipe immediately. Allpipe will assess the issue, work with you to organise a cleanup and notify the Department of Health.

We thank you for your understanding and appreciate your cooperation while this important work takes place.



What Do You Do When Someone Close to You Is Struggling But Won't Seek Help?

I was speaking with a bloke not long ago, Joe, who was feeling really frustrated when trying to help a mate who was avoiding Joe's attempts at support and refusing to seek help, even though he was obviously in some emotional distress. As is often the case Joe felt powerless in this situation and asked how he might better approach things.

So, what do we do when someone close to us, often a friend or family member, won't seek help? How do we manage the sense of obligation we may feel or the emotions that come with this?

First and foremost, we must remind ourselves that we do not carry the responsibility for other people's health and wellbeing, they do! However, in the above situation it is important to try and understand the reasons why some people are less likely to seek help when it is needed. We need to recognise that often when people are in the middle of a tough situation, simply making a decision to admit something is wrong can be a difficult and daunting thing. It can take time for some people to become comfortable enough with their situation to then contemplate the idea of accessing help. For others, negotiating feelings of embarrassment and shame can be quite overwhelming.

I take my hat off to Joe because, like him, we all need to recognise our role as primary carers, that is, everyday people in the community actively supporting and looking out for our mates.

Whilst our intentions can be coming from a good place, trying to get someone to change or seek help can put more of a strain on your friendship/relationship. Alternatively, simply avoiding the issue can foster stronger feelings of isolation and possibly result in the person becoming even more resistant. This can prove difficult when the time comes, and they are ready to reach out but may no longer feel comfortable with the idea of approaching you.

As difficult as these situations can seem, it is important to be there for people who are going through a tough time. You can do this just by letting them know you are available to listen when they need it and help when they do decide to reach out. In the meantime, you could take the opportunity to do a bit of research into what specialised local support options might be available, if required, such as a counsellor, financial/legal support or the GP, so you can be prepared and direct them when they do reach out. We also need to remind ourselves that the ability to listen effectively is one of the most important skills we can possess. Being a good listener can have a big impact on improving our relationships and helping others.

At the end of the day, it's also important to look after yourself. Setting clear boundaries is healthy and is all about understanding our limits. If you are starting to feel overwhelmed, talking to someone yourself can provide a good outlet and perhaps some insights into ways to manage the situation.

Most of the time, giving someone the space they need to arrive at seeking help is a good thing. However, if you do have concerns that someone is at imminent risk or danger to themselves or others, it is important that you act on this and seek professional help immediately. In these circumstances you may be worried about going against a person's wishes, but realistically most of us would rather deal with an angry response than a situation where the person we care about is seriously hurt or in trouble.




Directions

Cricket in Cunderdin

It is great to see that cricket is starting again in Cunderdin after a lapse of a few years. To think that in pre-war days, Cunderdin could field four cricket teams. South's. Towns, North Cunderdin and Rovers. course larger families were quite common in those days and as you will see these teams had three or four from the same family. Take for instance this towns team which had four Sheehan brothers.

From left to right, back row:-Tom Daly, the local bootmaker. He was a keen follower of both cricket and football and was most probably property man and scorer. Apart from his work, his only other interest was his

church being a staunch Catholic.

Joe Sheehan was wicket keeper and the oldest of the Sheehan players. Clem Stewart worked for Wally Warnes and was the father of that well known footballer Max Stewart. next two I cannot identify. The big young man is Corry Large, who worked in Halbert's Store and was killed in action in New Guinea. Fred Reynolds is from another well known sporting family of Cunderdin and was an uncle of Corry's and Dick Bycroft. Leo Sheehan, another of the four Sheehan brothers in the team.

Front row:-

Dick Bycroft, a descendent of the Reynolds family, and also a keen footballer, lawn bowler and tried his hand at golf.

Len Phillipe who worked on the telephone lines. Then two more Sheehan's, Pat & Len Sheehan. Len was an exceptionally good spin bowler and made the selection in a country team who played the South Africans.

Good luck to those trying to get cricket up and going again in Cunderdin, as there are many of the older generation who will remember many fun times while playing cricket in Cunderdin.

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The pain under the heel is worse when the person first steps out of bed in the mornings, or after sitting for long periods of time. It is relieved after walking about for a few minutes, then returns towards the end of the day. Resting will ease the pain, until vou get up again.

WHAT IS THE CAUSE?

The exact cause of plantar heel pain is unknown, but we do know this is a degenerative process in which micro tears occur within the plantar fascia. Several risk factors including over-pronation (rolling inwards of foot), tight calf muscles and long periods of standing/walking hard floors have been well established.






