After a very cold start to the day, the weather was perfect and the work was completed before 2pm.

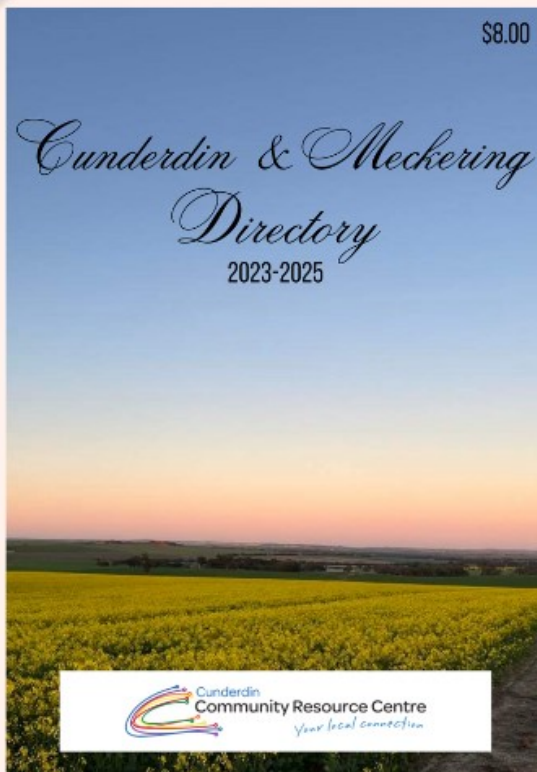
All helpers were supplied with lunch and afternoon tea, thanks to the Meckering Sporting Club for the use of their premises.

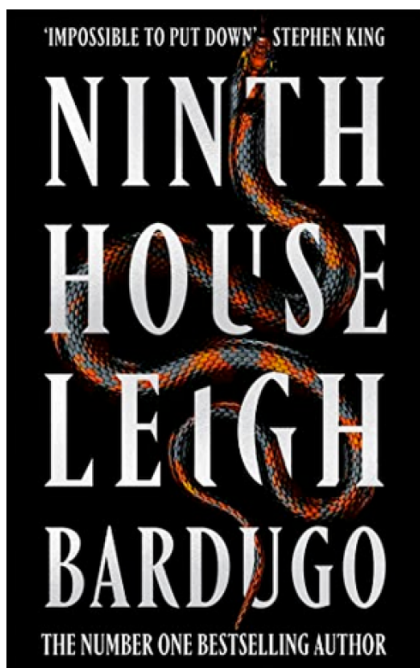
Deadloch - TV Series

York Police have charged three men with a number of drug offences in an ongoing effort to disrupt unlawful activity in the Wheatbelt district.

About 7.50am yesterday, 21 July 2023, York Police – with the assistance of officers from Wundowie and Beverley Police Stations – executed a Misuse of Drugs Act search warrant at a property in Beverley.

It will be alleged, during the search officers located various quantities of methylamphetamine and cannabis, as well as other drug paraphernalia.

A 37-year-old Norseman man was charged with one count of Possessed any Drug Paraphernalia and one count of Possess a Prohibited Drug (Methylamphetamine). He is due to appear in the Northam Magistrates Court on 11 September 2023.

A 37-year-old Beverley man was charged with one count of Possession of a Prohibited Drug with Intent to Sell or Supply (Methylamphetamine). He is due to appear in the Perth Magistrates Court today, 22 July 2023.

A 31-year-old Beverley man was charged with one count of Possessed any Drug Paraphernalia and two count of Possess a Prohibited Drug (Methylamphetamine and Cannabis). He will appear in court at a later date.

Officer in Charge of York Police Station Sergeant Andy Galbraith said the results are part of an ongoing operation that will continue to target those criminal networks and individuals causing harm to the community. #Fb

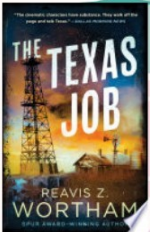

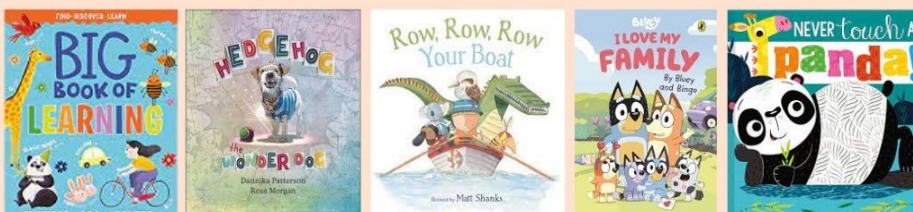

Self-Care - What Does it Look Like for Blokes?

A statement I often find myself saying to family members, friends, and individuals I interact with through the work we do at Regional Men's Health is *look after yourself mate!* This message does come from a genuine place of concern for these people and encompasses a key component of our vision statement which is *to empower men and communities to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health*. However, what does it really mean and look like for blokes living and working in regional, rural and remote WA?

Looking after oneself is best described as *self-care*. This involves a deliberate and self-initiated act to help maintain our physical, mental, or social/spiritual wellbeing. As humans, we all live different lives and the circumstances around our work, family commitments, individual capacity and environmental factors can change, so self-care will vary from person to person. However, for most of us we should endeavor for it to be:

Regular & ongoing (it's not just a one-off thing we do and forget about for the rest of the year).

More than just the time left over. Don't leave yourself the dregs, time for self-care must be a necessity not a luxury! Factor it into our daily, weekly, or monthly routine/planning.

An important part of our work-life balance. It can help us cope with challenging times and makes us more effective managing the demands of daily life.

For a lot of men, the pursuit of business goals and success (warrior attitude - winning) often pushes *personal wellbeing and health* issues down our list of priorities. When we think about it, acts of self-care give us the opportunity to reset and gives a *circuit breaker* effect on the daily grind and rat race that life can often feel like. Especially in these times of fast-moving technological advances, bombardment of social media influences, information accessibility and blurring of work-life balance (i.e. working from home, 24/7 access through smart phones). Self-care makes us more effective and offers us a buffer from the bumps in the road of life and ignoring this fact can result in us not being up to par in any aspect of our lives. Relationships can become strained, we can suffer burn out, harbor resentment, and miss out on the things that we don't realise are important until they're gone.

There is a varying range of definitions for self-care, but they all point towards us as individuals making the time to do things on a regular basis to help us live well and supports good physical, mental and social/spiritual wellbeing, including but not limited to:

Starting with small changes that we can manage. Ask yourself 'what's in my control, do I need to learn to say no to unhelpful habits, behaviors, or extra commitments?'

Changing our mindset and putting ourselves first. We shouldn't see this as selfish but a form of good self-management. We must actively plan and commit for self-care to happen.

Being connected to our passions, interests and a sense of belonging (family/community).

Eating well, regular exercise and a good sleep routine.

Getting a checkup with our GP and other health care professionals.

Remember, self-care starts with you so try doing something that makes you feel good, gets you excited and puts a smile on your face. If you're finding it hard to do this don't forget *...before it all gets too much... Talk to a Mate®!!*

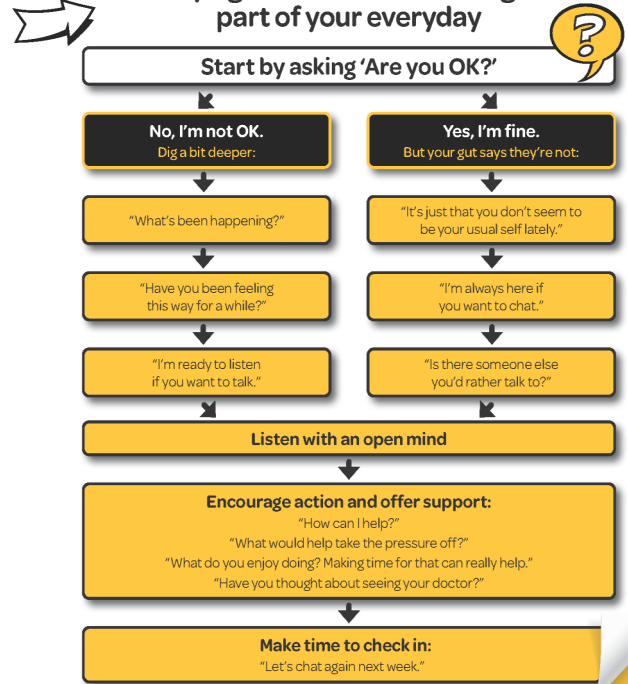



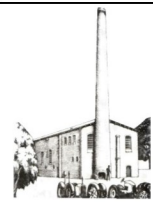

History Corner

Restoration of the “Buggy House”



No doubt many of you have seen the new/old look of the Golf Club buggy house.

Thanks to the Cunderdin Historical Society committee and Brian Reading in particular, the building has been restored to its old appearance on the outside. With the assistance of gifts of material from Rod Quinn, Max Kitto, the Shire Council and Geoff Jasper, and the willing hands of a number of volunteer workers, the old place looks great. The crinkle tin ceilings have been replaced and a new coat or two of paint will just about complete the project. Quite a few families have lived in the old place over the years.

The building was erected prior to

1900 and was first used as a dwelling by W. Blythe Simpson, caretaker of the railway dam. Other families known to have lived there were the Dave Matthews family, the Daniels Family, the Dick Marshall family and the Fred Cunnold family. Terry recalls the occasion when one of Snow Jasper's dairy cows poked its head through the window.

In between time of people residing in the house, which was most of the time after 1922, it was used as the club house by the Cunderdin Golf Club. In 1947 the club, held its first major event and from this small two room building with one big wood stove, no refrigeration and no electric power, the ladies catered

for over 100 men for three days of golf. Early morning tea, three course meal, afternoon tea and barbecue at night.

It was for a time referred to as the “pigeon house” as it was a favourite nesting place for these pesky birds. A few of the golfers with shot guns disposed of most of them and wire netting was placed around the top of the walls to keep the birds out. Now it is the “Buggy House”.

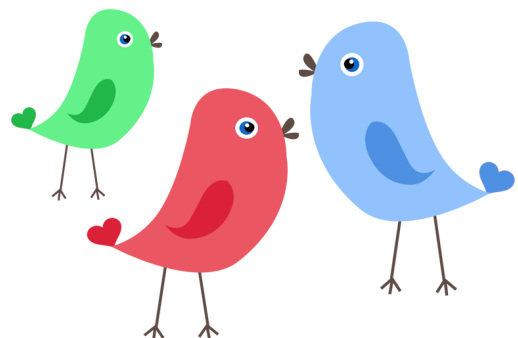

PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?
