

As a girl, Marie-Jeanne realizes that she can see the marks Love has left on the people around her—tiny glowing lights on the faces and hands that shimmer more brightly when the one meant for them is near. Before long, Marie-Jeanne is playing matchmaker, bringing true loves together in her village.

As she grows up, Marie-Jeanne helps her foster father, Francis, begin a mobile library that travels throughout the many small mountain towns in the region of Nyons. She finds herself bringing soulmates together every place they go—and there are always books that play a pivotal role in that quest. However, the only person that Marie-Jeanne can't seem to find a soulmate for is herself. She has no glow of her own, though she waits and waits for it to appear. Everyone must have a soulmate, surely—but will Marie-Jeanne be able to recognize hers when Love finally comes her way?



Morag MacIntyre is a Scottish lass from the remote islands that make up the northernmost reaches of the UK. She's also a third-generation pilot, the heir apparent to an island plane service she runs with her grandfather. The islands-over 500 dots of windswept land that reach almost to Norway-rely on their one hardworking prop plane to deliver mail, packages, tourists, medicine, and the occasional sheep. As the keeper of this vital lifeline, Morag is used to landing on pale golden beaches and tiny grass airstrips, whether during great storms or on bright endless summer nights. Up in the blue sky, Morag feels at one with the elements.

Down on the ground is a different matter, though. Her grandfather is considering and Morag wonders if she truly wants to spend the rest of her life in the islands. Her boyfriend Hayden, from flight school, wants Morag to move to Dubai with him, where they'll fly A380s and say goodbye to Scotland's dark winters.



Northam detectives have charged a 40-year-old man with one count of Criminal Damage following an incident that occurred in Northam on Wednesday 14 June 2023.

Northam detectives have charged a man in relation to an incident that occurred on Wednesday, 14 June 2023 in Northam.

It will be alleged, about 8.05am, the man - in the company of another unknown man - set fire to a Kia Ultima on Hampton Street.


In setting fire to the vehicle, the unknown became alight. He ran from the address and into the Avon River, opposite Broome Terrace, before both men left the area in a Holden Adventra.

History Corner By Edna Herley



The Cunderdin Hotels

It looks as though we are ready to have a new hotel, thanks to the active steering committee. Perhaps you would like to know something of the previous hotels in town. In 1901 a Mr Isaac Medbury was commissioned to build a hotel for Mr J.P. Doheny. This building was of Jarrah weatherboard lath and plaster with provisions at the rear for cattle pens and The outhouses. Hotel Commonwealth, as it was known, comprised a public bar, a parlour, sitting room, spacious dining and commercial room, kitchen and office, with ample bathroom bedrooms and accommodation

This building was replaced in 1910 by a handsome brick building costing one thousand four hundred pounds. This became a great meeting place for the farming community. Owned by Paddy Connelly, the

Commonwealth Hotel was an imposing two storey building with verandahs above below. The upper verandah balcony had carved wooden arches between the verandah posts. This building dwarfed the neighbouring shops and was greatly admired by the locals.

Substantial additions were made to the hotel in the early 1920's when Mr Connelly erected a two storey wing on the western side. An extra dining room was added to the back portion where men could eat in their work clothes. The front dining room was mainly used for permanent boarders and commercial travellers. A billiard room was added which later became the famous "Back Bar". In one area of this bar, more wheat was grown per acre, more sheep shorn for the best wool, worse droughts, biggest calamities,

both the best and the worst shearers, greatest loads carried, heaviest weights lifted, most water carted and the best games of football ever played in the district. This area was known as "Bulldust Corner". No doubt every pub had one, but this one was the greatest.

In 1946 the hotel was purchased from Connelly by the Cunderdin Community Centre Ltd for \$56,000. Under a succession of managers this hotel managed successfully until it was destroyed in the shocking earthquake which struck the district on 14th October 1968. The profit from this venture were of great benefit to the town, helping to establish the Greater Sports Ground, swimming pool and many other local projects.

The Story of Araluen

How the Seed of a Beautiful Idea Grew

In the late 1920s the founder of the Young Australia League JJ "Boss" Simons was drawn to this valley in pursuit of his dream to create a weekend retreat where YAL members could experience the outdoor life. Whenever YAL members travelled the world they were encouraged to bring back plants for Araluen as they developed the Park gardens which was to complement the aesthetic appeal of the Canadian-style log cabins, water features, and pergolas.

The YAL took over the Park with little to no infrastructure apart from tracks left as a result of timber clearing during the 1800's. Over 20+years the YAL constructed a series of buildings and several unique garden features. Construction methods varied but commonly used locally sourced, materials which became a major influencing contributor to the current unique style of Araluen and the Park.



The Margaret Simons Memorial Pergola (late 1930's) remains one of the largest pergolas in the southern hemisphere, it is constructed of 8 tonnes of granite stone and large Jarrah timber logs. There are 38 pillars which support 80 climbing roses of many varieties. The pergola was opened by Lieutenant-Governor Sir James Mitchell on Mother's Day, 1940. It was designed by W. G. Bennett and built by Jack Italiano in 1940. Built to commemorate Mrs. Margaret Simons, the mother of J. J. Simons. Mrs Simons, who died in 1937 at

the age of 77, was an ardent worker for the League with a keen interest in Araluen and roses.

In 1985, the Young Australia League sold Araluen. As the park changed hands, it was neglected until in 1990 a group of Perth gardeners who could see the potential of Araluen persuaded the WA government to purchase the property. It was then that the Araluen Botanic Park Foundation (the Foundation) with strong community support was formed. For the next 30 years the Foundation worked with the Governments support and some financial backing, and the commitment of community to restore and revive Araluen.

The Foundation is committed to preserving Araluen Botanic Park to enable West Australians to continue to enjoy it for generations to come.

Much was achieved in the early days, particularly in the restoration of heritage structures, gardens, paths, steps and terraces and creating more green space for visitor enjoyment as a main central lawn. In more recent years, the foundation has implemented and delivered on capital works projects. Building new carparks, the Forest View Deck function area, installing public Wifi a Telstra Tower, a solar powered Bore and CCTV for Public Safety.

The foundation is working toward continual improvement to sustain the Park for future generations. Maintaining the asset that includes over 30 buildings and structures across the site, fourteen hectares of cultivated gardens, and supporting infrastructure. With the community's support, the Foundation is fast achieving its vision.



There is currently more than 30 heritage buildings and structures in the Park. These are a magnificent collection of West Australian history and always spark awe and interest to the many visitors who flock to the Park. The log cabins and structures are a reflection of the spirit of community and years of dedicated efforts of the YAL and the Araluen Botanic Park Foundation, its staff and volunteers. Those who come to see the garden will discover and learn more about these structures on the interpretive panels.



Heritage Structures

Araluen Botanic Park showcases heritage unlike any other natural environment across the State. There are more than 30 buildings and structures. From the log cabins and structures highlighting the spirit of community and years of dedicated efforts of the Young Australian League, to our Chalet Healy Café, established as Tearooms in 1937, wherever you walk you will stumble upon history and heritage. Throughout the Park, interpretive panels will complement the historic buildings, structures and landmarks:



- Margaret Simons Memorial Pergola established in the late 1930's, the Pergola remains one of the largest pergolas in the southern hemisphere. It is constructed of granite and large Jarrah timber logs.
- Chalet Healy Tea Rooms (1937) Brisbane Cottage, Log Cabin and Shepherdson Cottage were all built in Canadian log cabin style using granite foundations, granite chimneys and tile roof. The latter two buildings were demolished (pre 1990) The Tea Rooms now operates as the Chalet Healy café under a tenancy agreement. In 2021, the Foundation has undertaken a heritage restoration to revive the original jarrah timber floors, installing bush timbers to the verandah. In 2021 ABPF completed a heritage restoration to revive the original jarrah. Visitors to the Café enjoy breakfast or lunch from the verandah overlooking the Stinton Creek. Twice a year, the verandah beams are covered by a stunning flowering wisteria, which also happens to be one of the oldest plants in the Park.
- Totterdell Cottage (1931) serves as our administration building for Foundation staff. Originally built for Jack Italiano and his family, the original stonemason who helped Boss Simons build the stone colonnades for the original structures in the Park.
- Aspro Cottage (c1930's) is complemented by an original terraced garden cut into the hillside north of the head of the Grove, built from funds donated by the Aspro family.
- The Round House was the original cookhouse for the Arlauen pioneers constructed with granite walls and ash concrete lintels, timber windows and a castellated roof. It has since been renovated and restored with a tile roof in keeping consistency with the other buildings.

The Grove of the Unforgotten (Simon's Legacy)

Built in memory of 89 Young Australia League members killed in World War I, The Grove of the Unforgotten still remains today. The Grove is a series of terraces, framed by pencil pines that form the shape of a lyre, the international symbol of music. Water cascades down the terraces to the pool of reflection. In the beginning, as is the case today, Araluen Botanic Park is a sea of colour as the tulips planted on terraces and at The Grove of the Unforgotten bloom.

Your enjoyment is brought to you by a kaleidoscope of colour in the form of 150,000 Tulips and a variety of spring blooms. Internationally recognised Camellias, Azaleas, and Grand Magnolia trees are just some of the beautiful flora you will spot against the backdrop of a stunning bushland setting. We have been blooming for over 90 years for our visitors and take pride in restoration of the circa 1930's style log cabins, timber bridges, stone pathways, gazebos and etched plaques that tell our story for you, your family and friends to enjoy. Enter a digital realm of magical exploration, chasing fairies and catching frogs using our new

Augmented Reality filters. Ask for a map on entry and enjoy a self guided walking tour, book into a craft workshop (details available on our social media), and enjoy live music on weekends at Chalet Healy.







<u> Wild Blue Lupin - Lupinus angustifolius</u>

About this weed

Blue Lupins originated in the Mediterranean but have been widely cultivated in agricultural areas as both a grain legume and stock fodder. But this robust annual has also become a serious and widespread weed as it dominates if left unchecked in urban bushland. But it can be almost eliminated as continuous weeding reduces the seed stock and seedlings are not allowed to mature. It is a prolific seeder which also modifies the soil condition.

Description

A robust, much-branched annual, deep rooted (2.5 m) and erect plant with strong stems growing up to 1.6 m in height. They are a self regenerating annual legume. The stems and seed are bitter due the presence of alkaloids. Originally



from the Mediterranean and widely cultivated as a grain legume crop and as a fodder crop. Stubble and large quantities of seed can cause poisoning in stock. Seed germinates in autumn, plants grow through winter and spring, and die with the onset of summer drought. Produces 'hard' seeds due to an impervious seedcoat and can remain viable in the soil for up to 20 years. This means it is almost impossible to eradicate Blue lupins from a paddock. Seed size is around 230 mg.

Impact on Bushland

If left it will spread all over bushland and impact on plant and flower communities. It is capable of fixing nitrogen.

Location

Occurs on the Swan Coastal Plain and through various areas in the Wheatbelt/South-West. Prefers sandy and loamy soils. Usually found on road verges, river edges and swamps.

Priority for removal

High: major threat to the conservation values of Banksia woodlands and South-West.

Management (hand)

Hand remove scattered plants prior to flowering. Optimum manual removal June to September.

Management (herbicide)

Glyphosate is relatively ineffective. Read the manufacturers' labels and material safety data sheets before using herbicides.

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The pain under the heel is worse when the person first steps out of bed in the mornings, or after sitting for long periods of time. It is relieved after walking about for a few minutes, then returns towards the end of the day. Resting will ease the pain, until you get up again.
