On a different note, everyone loves a story. There are a couple of organisations on the hunt for some stories, if you can help share a memory make sure you keep an eye out throughout the Bandi.



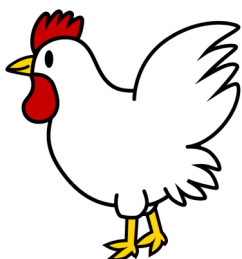

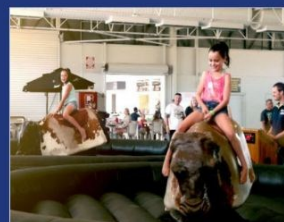

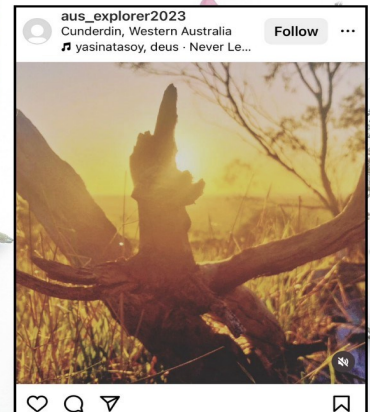

A little more than a month from now, the nation will go to the polls to vote on whether to enshrine an Indigenous Voice to Parliament in the constitution.

Because this is a referendum, voting will be a little different to a state or federal election.

We haven't had referendums all that often recently— in fact, the last time Australia held a referendum was in 1999 — so many of us are unfamiliar with how they work.

Here are the basics:

When is the Voice to Parliament vote?

Saturday, **October 14**. Polls will be open from **8am to 6pm**, local time.

The Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) is running the referendum — it's an independent statutory authority. Along with facilitating elections, the AEC is also tasked with running public awareness programs so people can be well informed about the process.

Who can vote in the Voice referendum?

All Australian citizens aged 18 and older. If you're serving a prison sentence of three years or longer, you're not entitled to vote in the referendum.

Do I have to vote?

Yes, voting is compulsory. Everyone who is on the electoral roll is required to vote.

How do I cast my vote?

There are a few ways, but the most common will be by **going to a polling place to vote in person**.

Polling booths are usually set up in public places like schools, churches, public halls and public buildings — just like a federal election. The locations haven't been finalised yet, but when they have been, the AEC will update this website so you can find the polling booth nearest to you.

Can I vote early?

Yes. Early voting centres — which are sometimes called pre-polling stations — will be set up before the referendum.

Can I vote online?

No. Australia's electoral laws don't allow for voting over the internet.

When does early voting open?

Early voting will begin on **Monday, October 2** in the following states and territories:

Can I vote over the phone? Only in two circumstances: If you are blind or have low vision or If you are stationed in Antarctica. You'll first have to register to vote over the phone, when you'll be given a registration number and will choose a pin. You'll then make a separate call to cast your vote, quoting only your registration number and pin so the AEC voting assistant will not know your name or address. **The phone number for this service has not been published yet.**

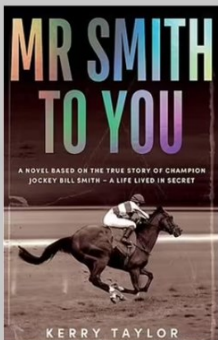

Mr Smith to You is a beautiful and tender novel about identity and a powerful testament to kindness and the human spirit.

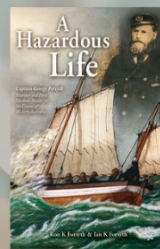

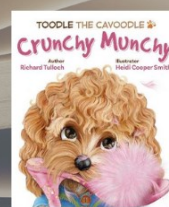
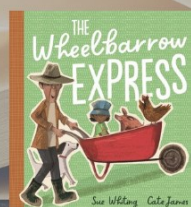

Grain growers and industry stakeholders are invited to participate in one of a series of 2023 GRDC Harvester Workshops to be held in the lead-up to harvest 2023.

Hear from industry experts and local growers on the integration of harvest weed seed control (HWSC) options, harvester fire prevention, accurate measurement/management of harvest losses and harvest storage.

History Corner

Cunderdin Co-op History

Part one...



The Cunderdin Farmers' Co-operative Co Ltd was officially established on 10th July 1917, after a prospectus had been in circulation since June 1914. Mr S.B. Donovan was appointed the first Manager/Secretary on a salary of three pounds per week. The original directors being E. Harris, J. Pascoe, W. Hastie, W.F. Kennedy, and H.R. Mullally. In October 1919, the Company purchased the business belonging to Mr F.W. Hollett in the main Street of Cunderdin, then called Railway Parade. This location is presently occupied by the Grocery section of the shop. The land and building originally cost eight hundred and fifty pounds.

In March 1926, under the Chairmanship of Mr J.A. Kitto and Management of Mr Jordon, alterations to the building were completed at a cost of three thousand pounds. The alterations gave the main building its present frontage.

In October 1936, the Co-op's first "Milk Bar" was installed in the Co-op building. In August 1940 and in June 1946 further small building projects

were undertaken to the main building.

January 1947 saw the Company purchase what the present office and old Tearooms from Mr Constantine Contas is now. The current office area was to continue to operate as tearooms for some time after this. After lengthy debate between the Co-op Directors, Mr Vic Halbert and the then Cunderdin Roads Board, the lane between Halbert's Agency Store (the present Hardware) and the Co-op was opened for general use. This then allowed the Directors to extend the main shop over the old Co-op lane way, now not in use. This is the area now taken by the large public notice board, right the way back through to the back of the Drapery department. July 1952 saw the construction of the covered fuel ramp in the northwest corner of the rear yard, and in February 1954 Cunderdin saw the commencement of its first "self-service" grocery department. At the same time the Drapery department was moved to the area occupied by "Con's Tearooms." Later that year the tearooms were moved to the small

shop next door. This area is currently vacant.

In 1955 the Directors thought it wise to move with the times and install a modern "Septic" toilet block. We still enjoy this modern convenience today. The present tearooms kitchen was constructed in September 1956. Mr B.C. Cunnold was at that time the manager of the tearooms and in September 1960 took it over under a lease agreement. In August 1960, the Co-op green grocery round was discontinued. This spelt the end of the house to house service.

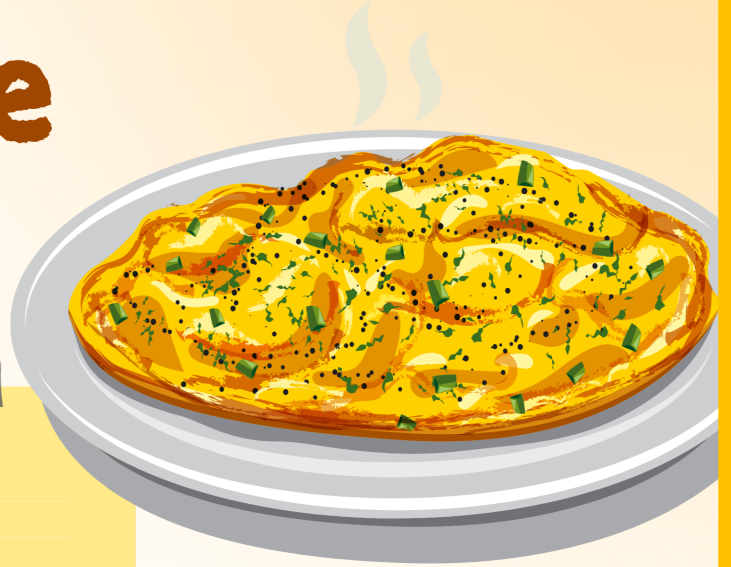
In November 1959 plans for major extensions to the rear of the main building were approved by the Board and were commenced. This opened the back of the building to what it is today. These extensions cost ten thousand pounds and included the central office, boardroom and strong room which used to occupy space in the centre of the Grocery department. In March 1961 alterations to the front of the main building were approved and commenced. This removed the old display windows and extended the front of the shop to the footpath. At the same time the bowsers on the footpath were removed and installed at the rear of the premises. A photograph of the original old buildings may be seen in the office foyer.

With the change in agencies from Shell to Caltex on 21st July 1979, the Co-op purchased a piece of land on the northern side of Lundy Ave., here the bulk depot was established.

September 1983 saw the purchase of the old Halbert building from Cunderdin Investment Pty Ltd,

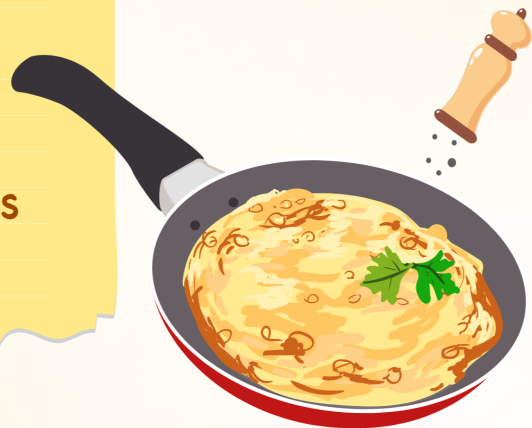

INGREDIENTS

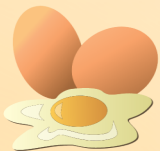
- 2 eggs

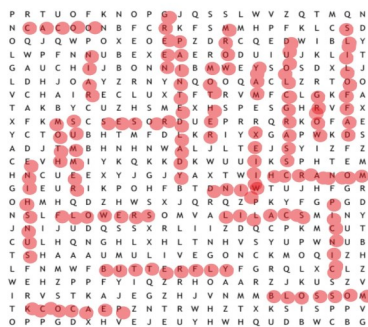

PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?
