If you look up around noon on Saturday 4th November, you will see a flock of man-made giant eagles wheeling effortlessly in the sky over Cunderdin

This is the start of the Carter Cup - the Gliding Club of Western Australia's annual competition for sail planes, named in honour of the former Shire President of Cunderdin who passed away nine years ago.

Rod Carter was President of the Gliding Club and an accomplished glider pilot - indeed the day before he passed away in October 2014, he was instructing aspiring pilots in the sport he loved.



Come noon on 4th November, his former companion sailors of the sky will be jockeying for position, waiting for the 'starting gun' for the first of a week-long series of races that will culminate in the best pilot winning the coveted Carter Cup.

An hour before the race, competitors will line up on the

runway at Cunderdin airfield ready to be towed up into the *Presi* sky and set themselves for a three-to-four-hour flight over the canola and wheat fields that carpet the Avon Valley in Spring.

They have to pit their wits against each other and work with nature to find the thermal currents that will hold them aloft long enough to complete the set course and return safely to the airfield.





Block your driver's licence to lock-out identity thieves

Money is not the only thing scammers are looking to steal these days – your personal identification can be just as valuable to them.

As part of their ruse, scammers posing as legitimate organisations or government service providers often pretend to need copies of your driver's licence and passport to verify your identity, when their actual aim is to steal it.

Having your identity stolen can cause devastating and long-lasting impacts, from finding unauthorised purchases on your credit card, through to having your name used to open bank accounts, take out loans and even to scam other people.

Just recently, Consumer Protection issued a warning about a fake WA Seniors Card website that was targeting seniors for both their money and multiple forms of identification. In reality, the WA Seniors Card is free of charge and applicants are never requested to pay a fee, or disclose personal identification in exchange for membership.

Aside from sending scammers your personal information, the other way they can get their hands on it is through data breaches that occur when cybercriminals hack into an organisation's system and leak their customers' details onto the dark web.

To help protect all WA consumers from identity theft, the Department of Transport has made it possible to put a block on your driver's licence to stop it being used to verify your identity online.

Putting a block on your driver's licence or learner's permit means if a scammer tries to use these documents for identity verification through the Australian Government's Document Verification Service (DVS), it will be declined.

You can add and remove a driver's licence block anytime using DoTDirect by navigating to the 'Protect your identity' section on the 'Driver's licence' page. Your authority to drive is not affected by having a block on your driver's licence.

To learn more about what to do when your driver's licence has been compromised, including how to block it or apply for a new licence number, go to www.transport.wa.gov.au

If you are caught up in a data breach, or have handed over your personal identification to scammers, your first step should be to contact IDCARE, a national identity and cyber support service on 1800 595 160.

"Shearing for Liz" Pink Day

Shearing For Liz held its 10th anniversary raising funds for the Breast Cancer Research Centre WA. Held at the Davies' shearing shed in Yorkrakine. With over 50 amazing items going up for action the team managed to raise over \$103,000 making the overall total for the last 10 years - \$500 000 donated to the cause.

The idea for the fundraiser began when shearer Tom Reed and his wife Lucy tragically lost their good friend — Albany woman Liz Roberts — to breast cancer. Each year since, the

Reeds have rallied a team of shearers to donate a day's earnings to the Breast Cancer Research Centre and have held the event at the Davies' shed.




Investigative journalist John Bailey is doing his best to turn his life around after losing the woman he loved. He has a new job. He's given up the drink. He even has a dog.

Getting Into the Driver's Seat – It's Our Health

Empowering men to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health, that's our core focus here at The Regional Men's Health Initiative. We do this in light of the adverse statistics that represent men's health in general and the notion that for a large proportion of men developing their health knowledge is not seen as a priority. This fits with men having a more functional view of their health i.e. not seeking help until we are virtually physically impaired by the problem. We often challenge men on these points but what does it really mean as a bloke to take responsibility for his own wellbeing and health?

As blokes we take responsibility and make a lot of informed decisions throughout our lives, on a variety of things such as family, work and social issues. Why then should decisions about our wellbeing and health be any different?

Too many blokes are running into trouble because we keep avoiding and putting off looking after our wellbeing and health. Just being a passive participant is not good enough, we need to be the one in the driver's seat in all areas of our health be it physical, mental or social/spiritual.

Taking responsibility for our wellbeing and health means becoming an active and informed healthcare consumer. It means scheduling regular service visits with our doctor and being aware of issues that affect us at certain stages of our lives, such as the potential for prostate problems as we get older. We also need to consider issues that could be common in our families (hereditary) and discuss these with the doctor. It's a bit of a generalisation but how many of us guys rely on our wives or partners for our health when it comes to our diet i.e. what food is in the house and what we eat for dinner?

Remember that it's not our wife's, mate's or doctor's wellbeing and health, it's ours. Good wellbeing and health can only happen if and when we as blokes take responsibility!

While taking charge is important it doesn't mean we have to go it alone, we all need help sometimes. From a community educator and support worker perspective, this often means our role involves walking beside someone helping to establish relevant pathways of support. It could also be simply listening to and validating people's issues and accompanying emotions. We see it as, walking beside the ute with the window down but not hopping in, it's your ride, you are the one in the driver's seat!

Our key message ... *before it at all gets too much*... Talk to a Mate[®]!! requires us to take some responsibility in that it's important we identify who our mates are so that when it all hits the fan (and it does happen) we have a plan in place to address things.

running as Brown's Agency Store. This now being the home Cunderdin Rural Traders, which is a fully owned division of the Cunderdin Co-op.

Since the Company was formed, the Co-op has purchased, built, and sold houses in Cunderdin. At present the Co -op own three homes, one in Margaret Street, one in Mitchell Street and one in Bedford Street.

In February 1985, the Co-op Directors commenced the major upgrading of the main store. This was completed in three months at a cost of \$100,000.00. Included in this upgrading were new freezer and refrigeration units at an extra cost of \$40,000.00. New wall display areas were built in the grocery, hardware, and drapery departments and in the following year floor coverings were laid throughout the departments. The final phase to these improvements was completed in August 1987 with refurbishing of the Office area and the replacement f the ceiling in the café.

Since then, the fronts off all buildings have been upgraded and painted and in 1990 electric doors fitted to the

Foodland Grocery store.

In accordance with AVCA rules the remainder of the old Halbert ramp was removed in December 1992. With a binned area constructed in this shed, gave the Co-op licenced chemical storage. In the same year, the old cool room was replaced by a combined freezer/cool room with display doors to the Grocery Department At the same time, new fixtures and fittings were installed for the display of fruit and vegetable. The total cost of these improvements was \$48,500.00.

In November 1995, the Hardware and the Drapery departments exchanged buildings. This gave your Directors room to increase the floor space occupied by the hardware which then allowed them to increase the hardware range of stock substantially. At that time, the hardware was separated from the Co-op to trade under its own registered trading name of Cunderdin Rural Traders.

Over the next few years, the drapery department was slowly incorporated into the grocery department to form one larger variety store in the original Co-op building.

In late 1997, the old Co-op ramp was replaced with a new Colorbond chemical storage shed. This is a lockable shed that fully complies with current regulations in regard to the selling and storage of farm chemicals. On the east side of this building a new ramp for LP gas was constructed. Late 1997 and early 1998 we replaced the remaining old grocery fixtures with new "barn style" fittings.

In 1999, the old shop front of the Rural Centre was replaced with new aluminium windows and electric doors. Cunderdin is in the enviable situation of having shopping facilities that are way above those of towns of similar size. It has been the support over the last eighty years from the shareholders of the Co-op who have enabled the Company to grow to its present size and to be able to offer you, its current shareholders, the large range of products and services that it presently does.



ATTENTION PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The pain under the heel is worse when the person first steps out of bed in the mornings, or after sitting for long periods of time. It is relieved after walking about for a few minutes, then returns towards the end of the day. Resting will ease the pain, until you get up again.
