TRY-A-TRADE

On Thursday 9 November the Year 7/8 students visited the Western Australian College of Agriculture in Cunderdin and participated in a Try-a-Trade day. The students were able to participate in 4 different workshops of Automotive, Construction, Engineering and Furnishing.



They created some great work under the guidance of WACOA teachers and their Year 11 students. The students were also able to experience the College life, participating in a tour of the farm and dining in the hall for recess and lunch.

SALT WORKSHOP

The Year 9/10 students participated in a Career Taster Program run by Supporting and Linking Tradeswomen (SALT). SALT ran a four and a half hour workshop with our students. They brought five tradespeople and each tradesperson was responsible for a group. After a safety induction and all participants wearing personal protective equipment (PPE) the students created a timber project from measuring up, cutting and assembling. The tools and skills involved include, measuring with tapes and set squares; cutting with a variety of saws such as hand saw, drop saw and jigsaw to assembling with drills, impact drivers, nails, screws, hammers, nail punches and different drill bits. Each tool was explained and correct use shown and overseen. The students all got to keep the toolbox they created on the day.







CANDLE MAKING INCURSION

On Friday 3 November our Year K-3 Students were able to participate in a candle making incursion courtesy of Bush Wicks Candles and Remote Society. The incursion was as a result of the money the students had raised during the Slime Run, and complemented the learning the students had completed in Chemical Sciences. All the students left with excellent looking and smelling candles.



Sally Soars at the State Gliding Championships

Hard on the heels of the Carter Cup earlier this month, came the State Gliding Championships run by the Narrogin Gliding Club.

Cunderdin's Club, based at the airfield out near the Agricultural College, had two contestants in this keenly fought competition - Sally Crawcour in her first serious contest, and Rob Hanbury a seasoner campaigner with national and international soaring experience. Wyalkatchem identity and former owner of its flying school, Glenn Hawser, was also one of the competitors.

They were in a highly competitive field with 16 other very skilled pilots flying some of the most modern high-performance gliders.

Sally flew our DG1000, a nine-year-old, 20 metre wingspan glider. As co -pilot and competition mentor she had long-time flyer, Russell Brierley,

in the twin-seater with her. Rob flew solo in his 30-year-old, 23 metre State Gliding Chan wingspan Stemme.

The competition was run over eight days late in November, but weather conditions caused flying to be cancelled on two days. The tasks set saw the fleet leave Narrogin each day to soar over many wheatbelt locations including Corrigin, Bullaring, Wagin, Eddington, Kondinin, Mawson, Muntadgin, Wyalka, Yorkrakine, Watercarrin and Cunderdin.

On day two, three gliders covered more than 400 kilometres and the fastest average speed was 133 kilometres per hour.

It was reported to Bandicoot Express that both Sally and Rob waggled their wings as they flew over Cunderdin, but no-one waved back - perhaps because they were flying at 9,000 feet and no one could see them!

Despite the fact that some pilots had to land in remote paddocks and be retrieved by their competition mates, everyone eventually returned safely to Narrogin at the end of each day to share their thermalling yarns over dinner and find out what points they had scored.

At the end of eight days, the winner was Ashey Boyle of the Narrogin Club with 5141 points, second with 5100 points was Norm Bloch from the Beverley Soaring Society and, third with 4820 points, was Arnold Geerlings, the 2023 winner of the Carter Cup. Rob Hanbury came in 9th with 3450 points, and, in her first competition, Sally Crawcour came 17th with a creditable 1707 points, ahead of Glenn Hawser with 1435 points.

Teams can consist of all males, all females, or mixed genders and team members may change for each game. Players will be handicapped according to experience and weekly winners will attract a handicap penalty for subsequent games.






Invisible Boys by Holden Sheppard - Book





Note: An additional use is a land use that is permitted on a specific portion of land in addition to the uses already permissible in that zone that applies to the land.

Warrior Wellbeing Article The Importance of Fathers

Our team at Regional Men's Health talk to a lot of blokes, the other important side to this is we also do a lot of listening. Comments that often come up, especially from men of the older generation is *I wish I had spent more time with my kids,* or *I spent my life busting my guts working and missed out on a lot of the little things.*

Life can sometimes be a double-edged sword and I personally have the utmost respect for men who saw their primary role as the breadwinner and gave precedence to their work, with the best interest of their family in mind. The downside to this, of course, was that these men were quite often too busy with work, or away from the family, to be able to commit time at home to do some of the little things that are now considered commonplace.

My partner did an amazing job giving birth to all three of our children at home (under the supervision of an experienced midwife) and I was actively encouraged to be involved through all stages of the pregnancy and birthing process. My experience, of course, is vastly different to that of men from my grandfather's era, who were told by the midwife *well you have done your job, we'll let you know when we need you!*

In modern society the family structure varies and there are no set rules on who does what. Women have historically been considered the carers and nurturers, but they may also have careers. The question I have is *are* we as open and accepting of men who show a nurturing and caring side as well as a commitment to his working and professional career? Is this balance possible?

Spending time with the kids is a priority for many blokes and I believe some of the most enjoyable and rewarding times comes from being in their company. Don't get me wrong we will all have times when we're challenged, tested (usually our patience) and sometimes even question our ability as a father, this is normal. In addition to this we need to be aware of and manage our work, spend time with our partner and make time to explore our own passions and interests (self-care).

A few tips for father and father/mentor figures out there:

- Don't be afraid of the everyday tasks when our child is born; changing nappies, bathing, feeding, they're all important bonding opportunities;
- As our kids grow get to know them and take an interest in their passions, interests, hopes, dreams and schooling;
- Talk to our kids, ask them how their day was, tell them about our day;
- Reading is one of the simplest beneficial things we can do with them;
- There is a saying if we spent twice as much time and half the amount of money on our children we and they would be better off. Keep it simple, time and presence are the most precious gift.

To those men out there who may carry feelings of regret, guilt or loss about what they missed out on with their children, don't forget that any guy can be a Dad, but it takes someone special to be a Father. Even if our children are now adults don't forget every child, no matter what their age, seeks the approval of their father. Tell our kids today that we're proud of them and we love them.

A few tips to keep your precious resource safe. - The first step in preventing fuel theft is to lock your fuel tank.

Security lights, if properly installed, can provide excellent low-cost security.



TRADITIONAL SHORTBREAD BISCUTES

4 Method Steps

I<u>ngredients</u>

- Melted butter, to grease
- 250g Coles organic butter, unsalted, at room temperature
- 100g (1/2 cup) caster
 sugar
- 300g (2 cups) plain flour, sifted
- 90g (1/2 cup) rice flour, sifted

Step 1

Preheat oven to 150°C. Brush 2 baking trays with **melted butter** to grease. Use an electric beater to beat the **butter** and **sugar** in a bowl until pale and creamy.

Step 2

Gradually add the **combined flour**, beating on low speed until almost combined. Use your hands to bring the dough together in the bowl. Turn onto a lightly floured surface and knead gently until smooth.

Step 3

Divide the dough into 2 equal portions. Use your hands to shape 1 portion of dough into an 18cm-diameter disc. Transfer to 1 of the prepared trays. Use a flat-bladed knife to smooth the surface. Pinch the edges to create a fluted edge. Use a small sharp knife to score the disc into 8 wedges and use a fork to prick the dough all over. Repeat with the remaining dough to make a second disc.

Step 4

Bake the shortbread in oven, swapping the trays halfway through cooking, for 40 minutes or until light golden. Set aside on the trays for 10 minutes to cool before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely. Cut into wedges to serve.

PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The pain under the heel is worse when the person first steps out of bed in the mornings, or after sitting for long periods of time. It is relieved after walking about for a few minutes, then returns towards the end of the day. Resting will ease the pain, until you get up again.

WHAT IS THE CAUSE?

The exact cause of plantar heel pain is unknown, but we do know this is a degenerative process in which micro tears occur within the plantar fascia.
