

# Cunderdin-Meckering network upgrade



Western Power has been working with the Shire of Cunderdin to plan an upgrade to the town's services in early 2023 and early 2024. The upgrade is focused on improving network reliability, maintaining high standards of safety and enhancing network resilience to major weather events. Western Power is making a substantial investment of \$5 million for the benefits of Cunderdin and Meckering residents.



### Pole replacements

- Aging wood poles will be replaced to maintain safety and reliability
- Hydraulic reclosers will be replaced with electronic reclosers to enable remote switching and monitoring, which will help in quicker power restoration.

### Overhead line replacement

Overhead wires will be replaced with covered Aerial Bundle Cable (ABC). ABC cable has improved service life due to covered aluminium conductors and clamps. This is less susceptible to environmental factors which will improve power reliability.

### LED streetlights

Streetlights in parts of the town will be upgraded to LED. These energy efficient replacements have a longer life than standard fittings and will provide a consistent warm light throughout the town.

Lights will mostly be attached to power poles in the same position as they were previously. More directional lighting will avoid 'spill' helping improve stargazing.

#### **Timeframe**

Construction is expected to start in February 2023 and will be completed in three stages:

- Stage 1 13th to 27th February 2023
- Stage 2 1st to 29th March 2023
- Stage 3 February March 2024.

The work has been broken up into stages to reduce the impact on the community, we've also considered seeding/harvesting when deciding on a schedule, as well as avoiding the peak of summer.

## WA government urged to consider upgrading runways in fire-prone areas

A bushfire-prone shire in remote Western Australia believes the state government should consider upgrades at key regional runways to accommodate large water bombers. This summer the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) had access to the Boeing 737 Fireliner and the C130 Hercules, which can each carry more than 15,000 litres of suppressant. But neither model would be able to land in the Esperance Shire, where four people were



killed in bushfires in 2015, because the airport's runway does not meet minimum strength ratings. Shire chief executive Shane Burge estimated it would cost \$20 million to upgrade the runway. "That could be something that the state government might look to put some money in," he said. "We don't really have enough money that would be required to upgrade our airport to cater for aircraft like that.


It is likely many regional and remote airports face similar issues. A DFES spokesperson said Kalgoorlie, Geraldton, Cunderdin, Carnarvon, Learmonth, Karratha, Port Hedland, Broome and Kununurra Airports "could be considered" as places to land large air tankers. But they said that could mean the planes operated "at reduced capacity. That means the aircraft can only take a partial load of retardant or less fuel than is optimal for maintaining high-tempo operations," the spokesperson said.

The large air tankers are primarily based at Busselton Airport and RAAF Base Pearce. A 'strategic' option Mr Burge said shire officials had recently met with DFES and urged it to map out where it would like the large air tankers to land. "We want them to have a look, strategically, at where they would like locations around the state to have those planes land," he said. "Once that's done, then we can start working on how we're going to achieve that. The DFES spokesperson said the C130 LAT, the largest air tanker available, can fly from Busselton to Esperance in 70 minutes and from Kalgoorlie to Esperance in 40 minutes, depending on conditions.

Water bombers deployed during harvest In 2019, a coroner investigating the deadly 2015 bushfires recommended about \$800,000 be spent on a Wheatbelt-based aerial fire suppression response to cover the Wheatbelt and Esperance areas. The government instead opted to send small water bombers to Esperance on days of high fire danger. A DFES spokesperson said during the hottest harvest period from December 23 to January 14 this year, a "strike team" comprised of a five-person crew, two fixed-wing water bombers, an air attack supervision aircraft and a fuel truck, was sent to Esperance.

The spokesperson said the full aerial fleet comprised up of 36 rotary and fixed-wing suppression and aerial

intelligence aircraft, including two Black Hawk helicopters that can hold up to 4,500 litres of water, foam or retardant. They are based at Jandakot, Serpentine, Bunbury, Busselton, Manjimup and Albany. In 2019 the coroner also recommended DFES look at upgrading airstrips in the north-west of the Esperance Shire so they could be used by water bombers.

## Be structured about reviewing your structure

When was the last time you reviewed your structure? I always start off any succession or planning meeting with a recap of a client's structure. Even for clients that are well versed with their structure, it always generates healthy discussion around who controls what, who owns what and future planning points. Then there's the clients that don't understand their structure at all. It still surprises me the number of new clients I meet that have never been explained how things are setup and whether this is good, bad, or ugly! As we are leading into the review season next year, make it a priority to sit down with your advisers and review. Your structure should always aim to maximise asset protection, minimise tax, and be as flexible as possible for future succession to occur.

### Things to start with are:

- 1. What's your trading structure?
  - a. Is it a partnership with individual partners? If so, then it's probably outdated.
  - b. Is it a family trust? Do you have individual trustees or a corporate trustee? Best practice is to have a corporate trustee. Who are the directors and shareholders?
  - c. With a family trust, who is the Appointor and Guardian? Ultimately, they control the trust. Check your trust deed to see who this is. Does the trust deed deal with who the successor Appointor and Guardian will be? Or it may revert to what that person has in their Will.
  - d. With a family trust, has the trust deed been reviewed for the Mercanti case? This is a whole topic on its own!
  - e. With a family trust, are there unpaid entitlements/loans owing to other family members that may have been forgotten about? Check your financial statements.
  - f. Do you have a company in your structure to take advantage of the 25% company tax rate? This tax rate is a lot cheaper than the top 47% tax rate for individuals. But note, Division 7A needs to be complied with and sometimes this can create some skeletons in the closet!
- 2. How is the land owned? Often it can be a mixture of land owned individually, jointly, or in trusts and companies.
  - a. For land held individually, is it held in joint tenants or tenants in common? This can make a huge difference to your estate planning.
  - b. For land held within family trusts, go through the above points for each landholding trust.
  - c. For land held within companies, who are the shareholders?
  - d. Do you have upcoming land transfers? Make sure your structure is setup so that you can <u>potentially</u> access capital gains tax and transfer duty concessions and exemptions.

In summary, sit down with your advisers, review your structure, and make sure its setup well and that you understand it. Get a diagram drawn up, laminate it and stick it on the office wall! If you would like Byfields to review your structure, feel free to contact me.

Over 100 Curtin University medical students will be spending one week in the Wheatbelt in March 2023. During their stay, they will visit local farms, industry, general practices, hospitals and schools, and participate in community activities.

We need local hosts to provide real-life experiences that will give them an understanding of what it is like to live in the Wheatbelt and perhaps inspire them to become rural doctors.

Curtin students will visit Cunderdin, Corrigin, Dalwallinu, Kondinin, Moora and Wongan Hills.

As a host, we will ask you to provide accommodation for two or more students, be able to assist with transporting them to/from town and share what it is like to live in your town with the students. You are invited to come along to a Thank You dinner with the students on the Thursday night.

If you live in or near one of these towns we would love to hear from you!

This is a life-changing experience for the students, with many having no previous exposure to rural life or the Wheatbelt.

By providing these rural immersion opportunities early in their degree, it has been proven that students are more likely to explore rural career opportunities.

Some students continue to keep in touch and visit their host families, some return to do seasonal work and placements, others have joined mentoring programs and some have inspired host family members to pursue tertiary studies in health and medicine.

## With Commissioner for Consumer Protection Trish Blake Record-breaking scam losses and victims in WA

WA ScamNet has released a 2022 scam report, with 1,203 people reporting combined losses of \$15,988,513 - a seven per cent increase on 2021's recorded losses and recorded amount of victims.

The report reveals online shopping and classified scams claimed the most victims.

274 online shoppers lost a total of \$876,774, with 270 buyers and sellers on classified sites losing a total of \$564,680 - likely due to COVID-19 reaching its peak in WA and the need to isolate at home.

The top two scams reported to the Consumer Protection Contact Centre were the Amazon phishing scam - an SMS, email or phone call about an undelivered package or item supposedly being held at a distribution centre, and the cryptocurrency investment scam.

Scams relating to the myGov phishing scam increased by 2,650 per cent from two enquiries in 2021 to 55 in 2022. In most cases, the scammers attempted to gain access to consumers' banking details by claiming the consumers were entitled to a refund.

Investment scams, mainly involving crypto currencies, were to blame for \$6,980,254 in losses, while \$2,871,468 was lost to dating/romance scams - with one individual losing \$800,000.

The disturbing 'Hi Mum/Dad' text scam tricked 59 victims into paying \$265,353 with criminals posing as desperate children needing urgent financial assistance from their parents.

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission has reported that annual scam losses nationally are at least \$2 billion and could be as high as \$4 billion. Alarmingly, a survey has indicated that only about 13 per cent of scam losses are reported to authorities, indicating that these figures are only the tip of the iceberg.

Scammers are getting smarter and scams are getting harder to spot so consumers need to be even more vigilant with all communication online and over the phone.

With every phone call, text message or email it's important practice the pause... and think, could this be a scam? If it is too good to be true, it probably is. Keep your personal information safe and only give it out once you have verified the legitimacy of the request through your own research.



## History Corner

## Town Hall - The Social Centre.

When passing our Town Hall the other day, I could not help but think how sad it was that this fine old building saw so little use today. I can recall when it was used three or four times a week, sometimes more.

Sunday afternoons it was used for Sunday School and prior to the Anglican and Methodist building their own places of worship, it was alternatively by these good folk, for their church services. It was also used by the Country Women's Association for the meetings until they built their The annual Anzac restroom. service was held in the hall as the Honour Board, now in the lobby, was fixed to the east wall. It was moved when the was extended. Masonic Lodge who also used the hall prior to the construction of their building.

Two flower shows were held each year, on in the spring and one in the autumn and the churches held their bazaars as money raisers. The Parents and Citizens conducted a children's fancy dress ball for many years and this was later taken over by the St. Joseph's Convent. The convent also conducted an annual concert where those students who learnt music could show off their talents. Visiting concert parties such as the "Brevitixs" were regular visitors to the town as were the Young Australian League Boys (YAL).

Then there were pictures every Saturday night and these were very well attended as there was no other entertainment.



The Reparatory Club staged many fine productions over the vears. The Badminton Club used it once a week at night. Then of course we cannot forget the great balls that were One of the held annually. greats was the Violet Ball run by the C.W.A., and the other was the Bachelors Ball which the young fellows of the town organised. This was tremendously popular with many visitors coming from Perth for the occasion. was always a New Years Eve Ball and the Catholics did not let St. Pats Day go by without "Heels-up" in the hall. The sporting clubs generally organised dances on a smaller scale to the balls. I recall the Tennis Club conducting a Flannel and Chintz Dance, which meant casual clothes. The bigger shows saw the lovely ball gowns and the men in dinner suits and quite a number in white tie and tails.

During WWII there was a dance every Wednesday night, organised by four or five young

girls, myself being one at that time. With an Air Force station in the town, there was no shortage of young men to dance with and there was no such thing as a wall flower in those davs. After the war we were treated to some wonderful concerts provided by migrants. One was a professor of music and brilliant a violinist. Another was a talented pianist whose wife had a very good voice. The young folk had their own bands and played for many social events in the town.

The hall was originally opened in 1910 and additions were added in 1923. This being the offices and library at the front. Further upgrades were conducted in the sixties.

Will it see more life? I would like to think so.

#### **Self-Worth vs Self-Esteem**

Self-worth and self-esteem are often confused as being the same, however they are very different. Self-esteem is about measuring ourselves based on external actions, while self-worth is about valuing our inherent worth as a person. In other words, self-worth is about who we are, not about what we do.

Society pushes for the need to have a high self-esteem but the problem with this is that we are always valuing ourselves against others. The competitive nature of men tells us we need to be better and above average to feel good about ourselves (keeping up appearances). When we look at this way of building our self- esteem it can be a losing battle because there will always be someone more handsome, slimmer, richer, owns bigger and better equipment and so on.

Self-esteem is transient and can change in an instant depending on what happens, for example we may be feeling good about a new piece of machinery or the quality of our stud and then someone makes a negative comment and our self-esteem falters, and we feel completely crushed. That's how fragile our self-esteem can be because it can also be fixed by a compliment that bolsters us again. Much anxiety can be created in striving for acceptance or approval and maintaining our ego or pride.

Probably the best way to understand self-worth is to ask ourselves how valuable we are, or how much do we deserve to have something we prize. It is a deep knowing that we are of value, that we are loveable and necessary to this life. One may feel a high self-esteem because they are good at something, yet still not feel they are loveable and worthy. When we have a healthy self-worth (at the very core of ourselves) we have a deep knowing that we are fundamentally a valuable and worthwhile person regardless of:

what others may say or do to us;

what our successes or failures are;

what we win or lose;

what we have or don't have.

The concept of self-worth is about knowing that we are always going to be worth more than all of our achievements put together. It is a good thing to think and feel good about ourselves but what happens when our self-esteem is crushed, does that mean we are no longer valuable? Absolutely not, however many people do think that they are no longer valuable.

Self-worth and self-esteem are vital beliefs for empowering oneself. A valid sense of self-worth is necessary to attain love and a sound mind. A valid sense of self-worth acts as a buffer against the possibility of depression and a feeling of worthlessness that can lead to despair or possible suicidal behaviour. Situational distress can come from many areas in our lives, as issues around these life events develop, we need to value our self-worth more than ever to reduce uncertainty for ourselves.



## Popping candy brownie

10m prep | 45m cook | makes 30



### Ingredients:

200g dark chocolate. coarsely chopped
200g butter, chopped
1 cup (220g) brown sugar
3 Free Range Eggs
1 cup (150g) plain flour
1/3 cup (35g) cocoa powder
1/4 cup (60g) sour cream
205g Cadbury Marvelous, creations jelly
Popping Candy Beanies chocolate block,
coarsely chopped

### **Chocolate icing:**

1 cup (160g) icing sugar mixture 2 tbsp cocoa powder

150g butter, softened

1 tbsp milk

### **METHOD:**

### Step 1

Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease and line the base and sides of a 20cm square cake pan with baking paper, allowing the sides to overhang. Combine the dark chocolate and butter in a large saucepan over low heat. Cook, stirring, for 5 mins or until the chocolate melts and mixture is smooth. Set aside for 5 mins to cool.

#### Step 2

Add the sugar to the chocolate mixture and stir to combine. Add the eggs and stir to combine. Add the flour, cocoa powder and sour cream and stir to combine. Add one-third of the popping candy chocolate and gently fold to combine. Pour into the prepared pan. Sprinkle with half the remaining popping candy chocolate. Bake for 35-40 mins or until a skewer inserted in the center comes out clean. Set aside in the pan to cool completely.

## Step 3

To make the chocolate icing, combine the icing sugar and cocoa powder in a medium bowl. Add the butter and milk and use an electric mixer to beat until smooth.

#### Step 4

Turn brownie onto a large serving plate. Spread with chocolate icing and sprinkle with the remaining popping candy chocolate. Cut into pieces.



### PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

#### WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The pain under the heel is worse when the person first steps out of bed in the mornings, or after sitting for long periods of time. It is relieved after walking about for a few minutes, then returns towards the end of the day. Resting will ease the pain, until you get up again.

#### WHAT IS THE CAUSE?




