

How the 'magic' of gliding above Wheatbelt paddocks gives Godfrey Lowe a new perspective on life

Several thousand metres in the air, Godfrey Lowe has found a new hobby and a new perspective. The Gliding Club of Western Australia's newest member was searching for a way to spend his time after his wife passed away a couple of years ago. "I'm most certainly on my Ls," he told the ABC from the airstrip in the Wheatbelt town of Cunderdin. "I've done 40 flights and about 40




hours and I'm learning. I can't land [on my own] yet. "I'm very much the junior around the club!"

The 76-year-old stumbled on his new thrilling hobby by accident while on a trip to the Wheatbelt in April. He looked up and saw a plane flying overhead, with a glider being towed behind it. "I thought, 'Wow'," he said. He went out to the airfield and, when he was asked if he'd like to take to the skies, he jumped at the chance. "So I was taken up, had a flight, had a waggle with the joystick ... and I wasn't sick. It was brilliant," he said. He was immediately hooked. "Suddenly this new vista opens," he said. "There's no engine, it's quiet, and through the window you get the sound of the wind. It's just magic, and you just see the horizon."

Mr Lowe makes the trip out from Perth to Cunderdin regularly to meet with friends at the club and to notch up more

flight hours. Fellow club member Clayton Grose, who has been flying for more than 20 years, took Mr Lowe out on his first flight. "Godfrey came to us accidentally," Mr Grose said. "He recently did his first cross country flight and loved it — got out of the aircraft with a huge grin on his face. "It's a rare and wonderful thing."





Glider aircraft are towed into the air via a long rope attached to a plane. It is quite common for those planes to be repurposed agriculture aircraft, Mr Grose said. The one they use in Cunderdin has been refashioned with a V8 car engine to give it more power. Mr Grose said with its flat landscape and prime weather conditions, the Wheatbelt was the perfect location for gliding. "If we do have to outland, we've got very large paddocks to play with," Mr Grose said.

Another bonus is that the group is based at an airstrip steeped in history. "We get the lift here, somewhere to outland, and a fabulous old World War II airstrip set up 80 years ago and some of the facilities that go with it, like this hanger — it provides us with a safe and secure base," Mr Grose aid. Mr Lowe said part of the enjoyment of his new hobby was the tight-knit community accompanying it. "Anyone can do it if they have the wish to ... and the camaraderie — they are a great bunch of people," he said. "It's incredible, you're up there free as a bird."

Reacher - TV Series







Cunderdin and Meckering network upgrade



The final stage of a \$5 million package of maintenance and upgrade work in Cunderdin and Meckering will commence in January. The upgrade is focused on improving network reliability, maintaining high standards of safety and enhancing network resilience to major weather events. The works include replacing more than 290 poles, 47km of overhead power lines, installing LED streetlights, upgrading reclosers, and carrying out other essential maintenance.



Timeframe

Stage 1: 13-27 February 2023 Stage 2: 1-29 March 2023

Stage 3: August-September 2023 Stage 4: 10-30 January 2024

The final stage is scheduled from 10 to 30 January 2024 and includes replacing approximately 10 poles, 17kms of high voltage overhead lines, two streetlights and performing other essential maintenance within the area.

(Works and timelines are subject to change for critical reasons including network emergencies, weather conditions, faults, technical reasons etc.)

Planned outages

To ensure the safety of residents and crews, it's necessary for us to schedule power outages. Affected customers will be directly notified of outage dates and times.

Please check your notification carefully as you may experience more than one outage. We plan to connect two temporary network generators in Meckering to reduce the impact of power outages. Residents connected to the generators may experience short power outages lasting between 1 to 2 hours when the generator is being connected or disconnected.




What are they really fighting for? And why does the king care so much about taking such a small French town? The Dogs aren't paid to ask questions but in their work, they have the means to make people talk.

EMERGENCY SERVICES VOLUNTEER DAY

In conjunction with the RRT, (Rapid Response Team), the Shire held the inaugural Emergency Services Volunteer Day at the end of March to encourage community members to take up a voluntary position with a vital services organisation. Despite the inclement weather on the day, a good crowd attended with a few volunteers signing up. Another volunteer day will be held next year in an ongoing effort to keep our emergency services viable.

VALE COUNCILLOR SAM STEWART

It was with great sadness that Council marked the passing of sitting Councillor, Sam Stewart, of Meckering. Sam came to Council a little unsure, but soon found his niche and enhanced meetings with his unique brand of humour and wide life experience. We are thankful for his contribution to his community and keep his family in our thoughts.

PALLIATIVE AND OVERNIGHT HOSPITAL CARE

Council has been tireless in pursuing the re-instatement of these vital services to Cunderdin. The group therapy room within the Health Centre is currently being renovated to enable it to be used for overnight and palliative care when necessary, and these services are now able to be offered once again. A more permanent solution is Council's aim, and we continue to work toward that goal in collaboration with the West Australian Country Health Service.

OLD HOSPITAL SITE & IAN ROBERTS LODGE

The transfer of land from WACHS to the Shire of the old hospital site has finally been completed. Now that the site is owned by the Shire, plans for housing will be commenced. The Shire is acutely aware of the need for all levels of housing within both Cunderdin and Meckering, and have been very pleased with the leasing of the Ian Roberts Lodge to a local business to house their employees. We continue to develop strategies to address the housing issue and are also nearing the completion of the development of our industrial area in collaboration with Development WA.

O'CONNOR PARK RE-DEVELOPMENT

Of course, another of the highlights of the year was the extremely successful rejuvenation of O'Connor Park. With assistance from Lotterywest, our park has morphed into the best playground in the Wheatbelt. Huge thanks go to Liezl and the Shire staff for their vision and acquittal in bringing about such a transformation. It is now a premier destination for families looking for an all-ages play area, and an attractive asset for our Shire.

MECKERING EARTHQUAKE GARDEN & MOSAIC TRAIL

In keeping with the Shire's desire to lift our tourism profile, the tired Meckering Earthquake Garden has been given a much-needed upgrade. Soon to be complete, the new garden better highlights the elements from the Meckering earthquake that so decimated the town back in 1968. AUTOMATED WASTE TRANSFER STATION

"It's been an overwhelmingly positive experience, and we can't wait to be back out again next year," said Radu.










PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?


