The Nancys by R W R McDonald - Book

A heart warming coming of age story with an 11 year old girl as the central character. Tippy and her uncles form the Nancys, an amateur detective club inspired by Nancy Drew novels. The Nancys work to solve a crime in the small New Zealand town. The writing style and tone reminds me of Taika Waititi, an incredible New Zealand filmmaker. At its heart, this novel is about family and navigating a way to belong.

Malibu Rising by Taylor Jenkins Reid - Book

I'm not one to normally go for this type of book - novels that solely focus on family life. Added to this, the book is written from different family members perspectives and in different time periods. Taylor Jenkins Reid has managed to nail this style, and this is one of many of her books, well written that keeps your interest throughout. With a strong central theme of the past not defining your future. A few of the characters make appearances in her other novels. You can easily read this or the others stand alone. No doubt there will be tv series adaptation of one of her novels soon enough.





Van der Valk - TV Series

First released in the 70s, there is a remake released recently which brings back to life the Dutch detective. Set against the beautiful backdrop of Amsterdam, Van der Valk and his team work to solve a series of murders. I always find European and Sandi crime series have a little more grit and darkness than the shiny polished and clinical US shows. Well worth a watch with a few seasons available.

White Lotus - TV Series



Package delivery

Parcel delivery scams use different methods to get your money, your personal information or infect your device. You might receive an SMS, email or phone call about an undelivered package or item supposedly being held at a distribution centre. The scam pretends to be from a parcel delivery service like TNT, Australia Post or FedEx. In the case of the emails, they attempt to make it look legitimate by including your name and address and professional looking company information. Online shoppers in particular need to watch out for fake parcel delivery scams arriving in email or SMS inboxes.

The SMS scam

A text message is received stating you have a package being held at a distribution centre and urges you to click on a link, which takes you to a webpage set-up with TNT logos, a fake tracking code and another link to 'track the item.' Clicking on this link takes you to another page containing the supposed package information and states you need to pay \$2.00 for a custom fee in order to 'schedule delivery now.'

This final link takes you to a streaming/entertainment service that asks you to sign-up for a 'free' trial period by entering your credit card details. Our investigations indicate the company behind this service is registered in Cyprus. BE WARNED – if you part with your financial details, you will be signed-up to a subscription that will cost \$79 per month with the possibility of further amounts being taken from your account.

The email scam

Apparently you have an "undelivered item" for which you may be charged a holding fee. You will be asked to open an attachment, click a link or download a file to retrieve your parcel. DON'T CLICK ANYTHING - If you follow these instructions, you will likely download a ransomware virus that locks your computer. To unlock your computer, scammers demand payment in the form of 'bitcoins' (a form of online currency) or wire transfer. Even if you pay the fee, there is no guarantee that you will be able to access your computer again.

The phone scam

The scam caller claims to be someone from Australia Post, saying they were unsuccessful in delivering a parcel . They offer redelivery but you have to pay them a fee first. The payment amount may vary and the scammer may ask for payment in a number of forms such as credit card or international wire transfer. The scammer may also ask for personal information such as your credit card or bank account details. HANG UP! If you are in doubt about the authenticity of a call, do not commit to anything. Instead hang up and call the company directly using their official customer service number via the <u>Australia Post website</u> to verify that it is genuine. Never use contact details provided by the caller, as this number will likely take you back to the scammers.

Protect yourself

- Don't open or click on links in suspicious or unsolicited emails (spam) or text messages delete them.
- Be wary of requests for additional shipping costs that come after you have purchased the goods all
 costs, including postage, should be included in the original purchase.
- Get in touch with the legitimate company using its official contact details to check if an offer is genuine.
- Look out for signs that a website may not be genuine, including spelling errors, low-resolution images or an address that is unusual or different from a company's authentic website.
- Never enter your personal, credit card or online account information on a website that you are not certain is authentic. If you have paid, keep an eye on your credit card statement for any strange transactions – otherwise contact your credit card provider and request your card be cancelled.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

The Shire of Cunderdin would like to advise that we are due to enter the Resticted Burning Period on the 14th of February, this means under s18 of the Bushfires Act 1954, it is unlawful to set fire to bush without a permit.

However, due to the seasonal conditions and fuel loading, no permits will be issued in the next 14 days, and this will be reviewed on the 28th of February.

Positive and Active Mentoring

Being a *male* is a matter of birth, being a man is a matter of age but being a positive and active *mentor* is a matter of choice, *he didn't tell me*, *he showed me*.

Wisdom can only be obtained through personal growth, ageing and the experiences we have in life. To me this means we can have a mature young man but not a wise one. I think this interpretation is important because it substantiates the vital role a positive and active mentor can play for us no matter what our age.

Who are our mentors? They can come from a pool of people, but are predominantly sourced from the following areas:

- someone older;
- for a bloke, dads are our first choice (92%). This is interesting because society's demographics are changing. Research tells us that in 1960 10% of all kids were living away from their dads whereas by 2010 this had grown to 27% of all kids living away from their dads. This is a significant shift and one that puts additional pressure on the vital role of male mentoring;
- father figures, grandfathers, uncles, brothers, teachers or sporting coaches;
- it can be someone who is not in your field of work or play, this can help gain a natural and external viewpoint.

When we are deciding what to do in life (whether it is day to day stuff or longer-term), talking to a mentor can help us with our decision making. This is important both in our personal life and our working and business careers.

A positive and active mentor:

- not only listens to what you're saying, but asks open ended and reflective questions;
- has opinions which you respect but acknowledges that you don't have to act on or agree with them:
- gives wisdom and perspective (lived experience);
- · acts as a sounding board and confidant.

When making major decisions, talking through issues with a mentor is beneficial. Young blokes especially need to tell their stories to mentors. It is by this process that they can validate and question where they are at and where they are heading in life. It helps them to clarify their issues, thus cultivating independent thinking.

There is never a time in a man's life that he won't benefit from having a positive and active mentor. Mentoring is about developing relationships, it takes time and sacrifice, it's a two-way street and everyone benefits. Blokes often have three types of people (mates) that we can spill our guts to. These usually come from the following categories:

- a peer;
- a partner;
- a mentor.

As blokes we need to identify who these people are. Ask yourself the question who is my mentor? This person may change through our life journey but remember positive mentoring is rewarding and being an active mentor is our choice.

The Old Railway Station.



I have just looked up in my Macquarie Dictionary to find the meaning of the word "progress". It means to proceed to a further or higher stage or to advance in general.

I am unable to apply this to our railway system.

Years ago when I was a kid (not quite in the olden days!) I recall catching the Kalgoorlie express taking my mother and us kids to Cottesloe for our biennial holiday.

The night before, my Dad and brother would take the two heavy cases to the railway station and book them through to Perth.

Next morning, after a quick bite, we would head for the station at about 5.30am to eatch the train. Dad would buy the tickets for us and we would wait in great excitement for the train.

Please note we did not have to book our seats five days in advance as one has to today. The station would be well lit up and a night station officer would be most obliging and assist us as much as he possibly could. It was quite easy to get on and off the train as there was a good long platform and any disabled person or person in a wheelchair could easily get aboard.

Now there is little or no lighting and no platform and a disabled person would not be able to board the train at Cunderdin.

When I arrived back on the Indian Pacific in the early hours of the morning, there was no lighting and I had to clamour down some small steps to the ground. I hate to think how a mother with a baby would manage.

Still I suppose that not many people travel by train these days. Perhaps they would if it was more convenient and the train took you in to Perth instead of one having to alight out in East Perth.

I still cannot call it progress.

Using greywater in the garden

Greywater can be a valuable source of water to use in the garden, particularly during dry conditions.



Learn how and where to use grey water at your place.

Greywater is water that comes from household washing machines, hand basins, showers and baths. Water from dishwashers and kitchen sinks is often referred to as 'dark greywater' as it has a higher load of chemicals, fats and other organic matter. Dark greywater is not recommended for using on gardens. Greywater does not include water from toilets, which is referred to as 'black water'. Greywater is water that comes from household washing machines, hand basins, showers and baths. Water from dishwashers and kitchen sinks is often referred to as 'dark greywater' as it has a higher load of chemicals, fats and other organic matter. Dark greywater is not recommended for using on gardens. Greywater does not include water from toilets, which is referred to as 'black water'. When used correctly, greywater has the potential to irrigate lawns and gardens. This helps keep gardens thriving and makes the most of precious water resources, particularly during times of drought and water restrictions. Using greywater also helps to reduce water bills and the amount of wastewater entering sewers or on-site treatment systems. Consult your local council or water authority for the latest regulations regarding greywater usage in your area. In some areas, untreated greywater can only be used in sub-surface irrigation systems.

How to collect greywater

According to the Smart Approved Water Mark, 15-20% of water used in homes is in the laundry. Large top loading washing machines can use up to 170 litres of water per cycle, which is a significant amount of water that can be directed out into the garden. Laundry greywater can be diverted from the washing machine using an appropriate greywater pipe or hose and collected in buckets or tubs. Greywater can be collected in the bathroom by standing in a large tub while you take a shower, the water scooped out of the bath or washing your hands over a bucket in the bathroom basin.


Where to use grey water

It's important to choose laundry detergents that are suitable for using in greywater. Detergents can contain phosphorus and salts that can harm some plants and affect the quality of the soil or increase the soil's pH (make the soil more alkaline). Soil with an alkaline pH (pH greater than 7) can lead to nutrients becoming unavailable to plants, particularly iron. You may start to see plant leaves becoming pale with dark green veins, which indicates an iron deficiency. High concentrations of salts can also damage plants and lead to burnt leaves and poor plant health. If plants irrigated with greywater start to develop pale or discoloured leaves, discontinue using greywater in that area.

Look on detergent labels for information about whether it's suitable for greywater usage. Product labels may say 'Greywater safe' or 'Greywater friendly'. Some laundry detergent manufacturers recommend only using washing machine rinse water to irrigate the garden and not the wash cycle water, so this needs to be taken in account when using greywater

www.lanfaxlabs.com.au provides information on the suitability of some detergents when using greywater. And add Greywater Fertiliser to greywater to help minimise the negative effects of soaps and detergents on soil quality.





Tim Tam Double Choc Cheesecake





30 minutes + cooling time



No oven required and can be made ahead of time

INGREDIENTS

3 x 200g Arnott's Tim Tam Original 50g butter

2 x 250g cream cheese, softened ¼ cup (55g) caster sugar 180g white chocolate, melted 300ml thickened cream, whipped 200g dark chocolate, melted

TIPS

- Use a combination of your favourite Tim Tam flavours on the edge of the pan. White chocolate and double coat Tim Tams make a nice contrast.
- You could use a Choc Ripple biscuit for the base, you may need to adjust the amount of butter to suit.

- 3. To make filling, beat cream cheese and sugar with an electric mixer until smooth. Beat in cooled, melted white chocolate. Fold in cream until just combined.
- 4. Transfer one-third of the mixture into a separate bowl set aside. Fold cooled melted dark chocolate into remaining two-thirds of mixture until just combined.
- 5. Spoon dark chocolate mixture over base of pan, spreading evenly. Gently cover with white chocolate mixture, smoothing the top. Chill overnight.
- 6. Serve topped with dark choc drizzle or extra Tim Tam biscuits, whole or crumbled, or fresh berries. Enjoy!



PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The pain under the heel is worse when the person first steps out of bed in the mornings, or after sitting for long periods of time. It is relieved after walking about for a few minutes, then returns towards the end of the day. Resting will ease the pain, until vou get up again.

WHAT IS THE CAUSE?

The exact cause of plantar heel pain is unknown, but we do know this is a degenerative process in which micro tears occur within the plantar fascia. Several risk factors including over-pronation (rolling inwards of foot), tight calf muscles and long periods of standing/walking hard floors have been well established.


