

Anniversary and the Museum's 50th Anniversary? I can't wait! Lots of events over the weekend, where will you be? Hopefully I can make it to all of them!




Why Women Kill - TV Series







Upcoming sewer relining work in Cunderdin



What is happening?

Our authorised contractor Allpipe, will soon commence work to refurbish ageing wastewater pipes in Cunderdin. Sewer relining uses trenchless technology to clean and refurbish existing wastewater pipes. It reduces the likelihood of blockages and extends the life of this important infrastructure by at least 30 years.

Where is this happening?

We will be working across the town of Cunderdin. Please reference the map on the following page for an overview of the work areas. For more information, including aerial maps with street names, visit watercorporation.com.au/sewerrelining

When is this happening?

Work is scheduled to commence in mid April 2023 and completed by late July 2023. During this period, we will generally work from Monday to Saturday between 7.00 am and 5.00 pm. Night works may occasionally be required, and in this case we will notify impacted residents in advance.

How will this impact me?

Allpipe will be working in both verges and/or roads, and also in the boundary of private properties. If Allpipe requires access to your property, we will contact you directly to discuss the work and arrange entry.

Residents and businesses may notice more activity in the area, noise from generators and vehicles and temporary odour. Traffic management will be in place to direct vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians safely around the work area.

If you experience any odour in your bathroom during this work, flush your toilet and pour water down the floor drain.

Where possible, please keep all toilet lids closed during this period. If water spurts from your toilet, please notify Courtney Hiller from Allpipe immediately. Allpipe will assess the issue, work with you to organise a cleanup and notify the Department of Health.






How does it work?

The nature of the sewer relining program means that the work is undertaken in stages, with a different Allpipe work crew for each stage. As such, you may notice that Allpipe will come for a few days at a time to complete the first stage, will be gone for a few weeks and then come back to complete subsequent stages.


Step 1 - Pipes are checked via CCTV

To determine exactly what we need to do to fix them.




Step 2 - Pipes are cleaned

High pressure water is jetted through the pipes. It may cause some gurgling or splashing from your toilet. We therefore advise to keep the toilet lid down. If water does spurt out of the toilet, please contact Allpipe's Project Manager immediately.




Step 3 - Pipes are relined

A liner will be installed into the old pipe by a machine to form a new pipe.




Step 4 - New pipe is connected

Lateral lines (property connections) are reconnected to the new pipe and junctions are sealed to protect the new pipe. This opens the connection to provide access to the system.



Step 5 - Pipes are checked

This ensures that the job has been done properly. If we find any issues we'll come back and fix it. We may need to return to the area to repeat the above steps.

History Corner

Cunderdin's Cowboy.....

Years ago, Cunderdin had a cowboy. A real live one. No he did not ride a horse, swing a rope, crack a whip or carry a "big iron" on his hip. He looked after the town cows.

Prior to the days of Pura, Brownes Masters or packaged milk, even before the town had a dairy, most of the locals had their own cows and they paid a young fellow to collect the cows every morning and take them out to graze along the road verges. Traffic was very sparse in those days, although people owned cows, very few owned a

At about 4.30 - 5.00pm, the cowboy would drive his herd back into town in time for the evening milking. It was surprising how these cows had become creatures of habit. As they were driven down Main Street one would peel off into Whitmore's, two would wander down the hotel lane, (the Co-op office area) and one down the Post Office lane for the Flanagan family. Further up the street one would peel off at the hostel, then located next to the old CWA Restrooms and one at the convent house (where Joe Bonser now reside) then one at Jenzen's

and so on until all were safely home.

As I have grown older, I have realised why my mother could seldom buy a tender piece of beef. When a cow became too old it was sold to the local butcher, and then back across the counter.



Last-minute Fried Rice

05m prep | 10m cook | 2 servings



Ingredients:

- 2 tsp peanut oil
- 2 Eggs, lightly whisked
- 4 bacon rashers, chopped
- 1 1/2 cups (180g) Mixed Vegetables
- 2 tsp ginger paste
- 500g Rice
- 2 tbsp soy sauce
 - 1 spring onion, thinly sliced

Method:

Heat a wok or large frying pan over high heat.

Add oil and swirl to coat the base of the wok or pan.

Add the egg and swirl to coat the base. Cook for 30 secs or until the egg is light golden underneath and just set.

Turn onto a clean work surface, roll egg into a log and thinly slice crossways. Transfer to a plate and cover to keep warm.

Add the bacon to the wok or pan. Cook, stirring for 3 mins or until browned.

Add the vegetable and ginger paste and cook, stirring for 3 mins.

Add the rice and cook, stirring for 3 mins or until heated through

Add the soy sauce to the rice mixture and toss to combine.

Top with the egg and sprinkle with the spring onion. Season to serve.

PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The pain under the heel is worse when the person first steps out of bed in the mornings, or after sitting for long periods of time. It is relieved after walking about for a few minutes, then returns towards the end of the day. Resting will ease the pain, until you get up again.






