



The Lions Cancer Institute (LCI) will be providing a free Skin Cancer Screening in **Cunderdin** on **29**th **of April 2023.** This free service provides for the early detection of skin lesions and where a lesion is identified a referral is made to your GP for further investigation. For booking information contact **0428362017**

The LCI is a project of the Lions Clubs of Western Australia. Since early 1990's LCI has been providing full body skin screening clinics throughout Western Australia, with an emphasis on Screening the remote and rural areas of the state.

From humble beginnings the Volunteers of LCI have screened over 80 000 patients and our records show that with the annual rate of referrals to a GP is in the order of 27% (21,600) and lesions



suspected of being life threatening are at 6% (1260). Early detection of lesions will save lives and lessen the need for invasive surgery.

LCI's screening program is supported by qualified volunteer Dermatologists, Plastic Surgeons, Dermoscopists and GP's.



Funding for LCI's screening programs and research grants is provided by donations from Lions Clubs of WA, Business and from the public.

The Bible provides the key to unlock the wonder of prophecy and a hope for those who are prepared to understand Almighty God's plan for this perplexing world.




Knives Out - Film

Centred around the death of a wealthy novelist at his birthday party, detective Benoit Blanc is hired to investigate and determine which of the party guests are responsible. Think murder mystery night sprinkled with a little bit of Agatha Christie. This film is jam packed full of Hollywood's best - Daniel Craig, Chris Evans, Jamie Lee Curtis and Toni Collette to name a few. Look out for another Benoit Blanc mystery - Glass Onion on Netflix too. I'd recommend watching Knives Out first.

Boy Swallows Universe by Trent Dalton - Book

This has been around for a while, so I'm sure many of you have read it. It has received countless awards and even it's own Netflix series. This is technically a novel, however there are elements of this story that are true to Trent Dalton's own childhood experiences. This is a terrifyingly chaotic coming of age story for a young boy in Brisbane. Learning to navigate the world around him, young Eli Bell attempts to improve his circumstances but it is an uphill battle. This book will have you laughing, crying, fearful and anger. A devastatingly raw novel with a unique Australian voice - highly recommend this.





Ticket to Ride Europe - Boardgame

Rivers of London by Ben Aaronovitch - Book

Excellent urban fantasy series. What does urban fantasy mean?! Don't worry I had no idea about this genre until my sister introduced me to this series. Urban fantasy combines unreal or imaginary elements into a contemporary urban setting. You'll be put at ease with the mention of recognisable landmarks of London throughout while ghosts and other creatures pop up. This is the first novel in the series that follows Peter Grant, a Probationary Constable who dreams of being a detective. He is quickly recruited to a special division set up to investigate crimes involving magic. Jump in for a wild ride.

Warrior Wellbeing Article

We Are Not The Same - Is It Embedded In Our Masculinity?

Quite often as blokes we have been told to get in touch with our feminine side. Over time this narrative has been part of the language barrier that has put bloke's positive approaches to wellbeing issues and help seeking in reverse.

There are three parts to our health: physical, mental and social/spiritual wellbeing. The latter is where we find: our identity, our individuality, our own sense of self, our sense of belonging, our passions and interests and our emotional *context* (not a feminine side!)

We are the same species but putting it simply men and women have evolved differently. Our DNA is 99.6% similar but it is that 0.4% difference that we need to talk about and address, because it helps explain why blokes have a warrior attitude to life and in turn helps explain why we seek help differently.

There are three main areas of difference that we talk about in the work we do:

1. Communication

- On average blokes will talk one third less than ladies per day (7,000 words to 21,000 words) this starts from a young age from boys through to men. Anyone with a wife, mother, mother-in-law, daughter, or partner will know this. Ladies, talking is a good thing as it helps address/highlight a whole lot of issues.
- It is perfectly normal for blokes to talk in dot points or even just grunt!

2. Risk-taking

- Blokes are hard wired to take risks from an early age. Some of this is linked to our brain development. The brain development stage for a lady is roughly between the ages of 18 to 20 years, whereas for a bloke it is between the ages of 25 to 28 years (some may say 45 to 50 years!)
- As we get older, we get wiser, but we are still hard wired to take risks.

3. Winning (an important part of the warrior culture)


- The majority (90%) of Aussie men think winning is important (a trait that can be traced back to our true warrior days, hunting for survival);
- An alarming statistic is that 50% of blokes think winning is all that matters. So quite often blokes don't take a backward step when it comes to finances, relationships and/or business matters.

The importance blokes place on winning, explains why a loss event and/or a sense of loss becomes problematic and can be hard to deal with. Combine this with the lack of understanding of our emotions and we may be a ticking time bomb.

As blokes we need to be more aware of our emotions and that it is alright to show them. We will all experience emotional issues throughout our lives. During these times we should openly express our emotions maybe through a hug or a cry and/or use language that is foreign to us i.e. I am sad, and/or I am struggling here.

Talk to a Mate®!! It is beneficial, and you will realise that it's not just you that may be struggling, there's a lot of other blokes out there feeling the same way.

The Cunderdin Volunteer Defence Corp.

Did you know that Cunderdin boasted "DAD'S once ARMY"? Mr. Arthur Devenish, farmer of North Cunderdin took the par of Captain Mainwaring. Every Sunday morning would see the members of D. Cov., No. 9 BV Volunteer Platoon take up their trustee .303's and off to be instructed in the art of Home Defence. Officers from the Northam Military Camp and the local RAAF Station put these gallant fellows through various exercises.

When the Pacific situation became serious, members were delegated to various positions about the town to be protected.

Paul Howitt and my father, Laurie Snooke were to protect the dam and were to take up position at Hird's rock. Not far from where Don Buegge and Chris Bassanelli now have their new homes. The fact that a bomb on Mundaring Weir could have put the whole water supply from there to Kalgoorlie completely out of service seemed to have escaped the minds of the powers that were.

Of course there was always the social side to be enjoyed, that was when the canteen opened after parade. This took place at Peter Pascoe's property "Little Hell" and was usually associated with a game of "two-up".

For several years the Home Guard organised a New Years Eve Ball with the profits going towards the local Patriotic Council. The "top brass" from Northam and Perth would attend and the music was provided by the Air Force band. Most of the fellows attended in their uniforms which were made of dark green, light woollen material, but left their army boots at home.

INGREDIENTS

MEATBALLS

500g raw chorizo sausages, casings
removed and chopped finely
250g pork or beef mince
3/4 cup fine sourdough breadcrumbs
1/2 cup milk
1 egg, lightly beaten
2 cups mixed herbs, leaves chopped
(thyme, oregano and parsley)
1/4 cup (60ml) Worcestershire sauce
2 cups coarsely grated cheese (cheddar
and mozzarella)

RAGU

lkg overripe tomatoes, roughly
chopped (see tips)
3 garlic cloves, crushed
2 tsp caster sugar
2 tbs tomato paste
1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil



Oven Roasted Chorizo Meatballs with Tomato Ragu

4 servings 600 Low effort

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat oven to 220C, place all the raguing redients into a roasting pan and season. Cover with foil and roast for 30 mins. Depending on the tomatoes you use, check how they are going.
 Remove the foil and roast for a further 30 mins until thick and sauce. Don't let them dry out.
- 2. Meanwhile combine breadcrumbs and milk in a bowl. Ensuring there is enough milk to dampen all the breadcrumbs. Leave it to soak up all the milk should take 5 mins. Then combine all the meatball ingredients (except for the cheese) into a bowl ensuring all herbs are mixed through.
- 3. Divide up into equal sized balls. Place on a greased roasting tray and bake for 20 mins.
- 4. Combine meatballs into the tomato ragu and top with cheese. Bake for another 15 mins or until the meatballs are fully cooked and the cheese is golden.
- 5. Serve with pasta or garlic bread and a green salad.

Tips:

- Use whatever tomatoes you have on hand canned or fresh. I have made this with either. You can use fresh or canned cherry tomatoes, crushed tomatoes or whole tomatoes. Great way to use up overripe tomatoes.
- Sub in dried herbs if you do not have fresh herbs, you will only need 1/2 cup at most.
- You can buy chorizo crumb from the deli section to be even more efficient.



PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The pain under the heel is worse when the person first steps out of bed in the mornings, or after sitting for long periods of time. It is relieved after walking about for a few minutes, then returns towards the end of the day. Resting will ease the pain, until vou get up again.


