It has become a very important date on our yearly calendar.


Cunderdin ANZAC Day

The Last of Us - TV Series + Game

I'm not one for zombie apocalypses, but this show reminded me you can never fully ride off a genre. It's always worth a try, even on episode. The Last of Us does have zombies (kinda) and definitely an apocalyptic setting. But the rich character development and stories is the overwhelming feature of this tv series. Based on a video game of the same name, this will have you on a rollercoaster of emotions. Beautifully made, with a wonderful cast - this has lived up to the hype. There is also a companion podcast worth listening along to as you finish episodes if you are after more.





The Dry by Jane Harper - Book + Film

You may have already noticed, I love a good crime novel. And likely most people have read at least one of Jane Harper's novels. The Dry was her debut novel in 2016 and it won multiple awards. Follows a small town cop trying to uncover the truth in a small country town. Definition of a page turner, you'll have this wrapped up in a few days or less. In 2020 it was released as a film, with Eric Bana as Aaron Falk, the central character. Filmed across the Wimmera and Mallee regions of Victoria, it's a stunning backdrop and true to the descriptions in the novel.

The Salisbury Poisonings - TV Series

Two Russian nationals were poisoned by a nerve agent on the streets of Salisbury, England in 2018. It made international headlines and again raised questions about the reach of the Kremlin. This three part mini series is a dramatisation of the real events. The heavy burden of fear and uncertainty rang through clearly in the casts performance. This mini series sets you up with good context for my next suggestion so I'd encourage you to watch this first.





Secrets of the Salisbury Poisonings - Documentary

Released in 2021, this documentary digs deeper into the case with accounts from those closest to the response to the incident and those who knew the people involved the best. I found this very insightful on chemical warfare including how easily it can greatly impact unsuspecting civilians and those who responded and potentially risked their own lives to protect and save others. Makes you consider how far we have actually come since the Cold War and what more needs to be done to avoid similar incidents in the future.

BorrowBox-App

This application allows you to borrow books (audio or e-books) directly to your device FOR FREE! Yes no need to pay for an Audible subscription. You will need to wait for some popular titles, there is a reservation system within the app. There are hundreds of titles to keep you occupied in the meantime. Perfect way to get through more books, I have found it easy to pop an audiobook on while driving to Perth, cooking or doing Paint by Numbers (see my next recommendation). Not all narrators of all books will gel with you, but give it a shot. Look for ones with a full cast of voices.

Paint by Numbers - Activity

Start this by saying, I am not a creative. I found myself glued to a screen in some form even after my work day had finished. To unwind, and avoid doom scrolling on social media a friend suggested I buy a paint by numbers kit. You select a design, its printed on canvas and delivered to you with all the paints and brushes you need. And as the name suggests, you just paint based on the numbered sections. Very relaxing while still engaging, and you get a wonderful painting at the end of it. Lots of kits are available online and craft stores do stock a limit range of designs.

Understanding Stress

Stress is usually associated with not being in control of a situation or an environment leading us to feel uncomfortable in body and/or mind. It is a part of life and it affects everyone at one time or another. Stress is normal, a certain amount of stress energizes people consequently improving performance and efficiency.

When stress levels get too high, problems can develop and start to take their toll on our mental health, physical health and social/spiritual wellbeing, sometimes with dire consequences. At RMHI we refer to *situational distress* to explain those times in our lives that create extreme stress which can start from situations that are unresolved in our lives. If we are always saying things like *I haven't got enough time, I must get this done before..., I'll never finish in time, I can't get anything done*; we might be in danger of moving from *stressed* to being *distressed*.

It is important to remember that what might be stressful for some may not be stressful for others. We all deal with things differently and have different capacities to cope.

How do you currently cope with stress? Are your coping strategies healthy or unhealthy, helpful or unproductive? Many people cope with stress in ways that compound the problem. Below are unhealthy strategies that may temporarily reduce stress but will cause more damage in the long run:

- Sleeping too much;
- Filling up every minute of the day to avoid facing problems;
- Withdrawing from friends, family and activities;
- Taking out your stress on others (lashing out, anger outbursts, physical violence);
- Drinking too much;
- Procrastinating;
- Overeating or undereating;
- Over analysing;
- Smoking;
- Using pills/drugs to relax;
- Zoning out for hours in front of the television or the computer.

Here are some tips that may help deal with stressful situations:

- *Avoid* the stressor. Learn to say *no*, limit time with those who stress you out (if possible), control your environment i.e. turn the news off if it makes you anxious, give the bookwork to the bookkeeper.
- *Alter* the stressor. Communicate your concerns i.e. *Talk to a Mate*, ask for a behaviour change but be willing to also compromise, be more assertive, manage your time better.
- *Adapt* to the stressor. If you can't change the stressor, change yourself, look at the stressful situation more positively, will it matter in the long run? If the answer is *no* refocus elsewhere, set reasonable standards not perfectionism, look at all the good things in your life if feeling stressed out.
- *Accept* the stressor. Some stressors are unavoidable, in such cases accept things as they are. This can be difficult but easier than railing against an unchangeable situation.

Finding and creating ways to relax when you are stressed out will also help i.e. exercise, get a massage, listen to music to calm down and/or ... before it all gets too much ... Talk to a Mate®!! Most importantly if you feel you are not coping, despite your efforts to do so, we recommend a visit to your GP before you reach a crisis point.



Beware the new breed of bank scams

Scammers have been pretending to call or text from financial institutions for years, but it's the latest twist on these banking impersonation scams that should have all consumers on high alert.

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) raised the alarm after reports to Scamwatch indicated new technology was being used to make scam calls look like they were coming from the bank's legitimate phone number and to allow scam texts to appear in the same conversation thread as genuine bank messages.

These tricks mean it may not be possible for consumers to distinguish a real message or call from those that aren't based on a phone number or message thread alone, and sadly many are falling victim.

Since January 2022, our WA ScamNet team has heard from 20 victims who reportedly lost \$1.9 million to bank impersonation scams. When you consider that's an average loss of almost \$96,000 per person, it's clear just how financially and emotionally devastating these scams can be.

One WA victim's bank account was drained of almost \$41,000, after she answered a call from the same number as one listed on the back of her credit card. Posing as a bank employee, the scammer claimed her accounts had been hacked as a ruse to gain control of her finances.

A big red-flag is communications that come with a sense of urgency, such as claims of fraudulent activity or a frozen account. No matter how legitimate the call or message seems, a bank will never ask you to urgently transfer funds.

We urge all WA consumers to 'practice the pause' to stop scammers in their tracks. If you receive an SMS with a phone number to call, do not use it. Instead, call your bank direct on a number you have sourced yourself. Likewise, hang up if you receive a call from someone claiming to be from your bank requesting you to transfer money to 'keep it safe'. Ask for a reference number and call your bank back using contact details you have found independently.

Never provide online banking passwords, one-time security codes, pins or tokens to anyone over the phone.



Marbled pumpkin cheesecake brownies

Ingredients:



- 300g dark chocolate, chopped
- 1 cup (220g) caster sugar
- 3 Free Range Eggs
- 1 1/4 cups (185g) plain flour
- 1/4 cup (25g) cocoa powder
- 1/4 cup (60g) sour cream
- 250g cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup (400g) pumpkin puree





<u>Method:</u>

<u>Step 1</u>

Preheat oven to 160C. Grease and line a 20cm (base measurement) square cake pan with baking paper, allowing 2 sides to overhang.

<u>Step 2</u>

Combine the butter and chocolate in a medium saucepan over low heat.

Cook, stirring, for 5 mins or until butter and chocolate melt.

Remove from heat.

<u>Step 3</u>

Add 2/3 cup (150g) of the sugar and stir to combine.

Add 2 of the eggs and stir to combine. Add the flour, cocoa powder and sour cream. Stir to combine.

<u>Step 4</u>

Use an electric mixer to beat the cream cheese and remaining sugar in a bowl until well combined.

Add the remaining egg and pumpkin puree and beat until just combined.

<u>Step 5</u>

Spoon the chocolate mixture and cream cheese mixture, alternating, over the base of the pan. Use a skewer to swirl to create a marbled effect.

Bake for 40 mins or until a skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean. Set aside in the pan for 1 hour to cool.

Cut into pieces to serve.



ATTENTION PEOPLE WITH HEEL AND ARCH PAIN

Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The pain under the heel is worse when the person first steps out of bed in the mornings, or after sitting for long periods of time. It is relieved after walking about for a few minutes, then returns towards the end of the day. Resting will ease the pain, until you get up again.
