

I enjoy watching community sports and supporting our teams, travelling and city night life. I look forward to seeing you all throughout the next 12 months.






Utopia - TV Series





Chernobyl - TV Series + Podcast

Devastatingly beautiful. This series certainly haunted my thoughts long after I finished watching it. An important and topical series to dive into if you haven't already. Chernobyl is a historical drama series following the actions (and inactions) of various people in the aftermath of the 1986 nuclear disaster. It tells the story of the people on the ground who were first responders, miners and volunteers who put their lives in danger in the clean up in an attempt to save others. Each scene of this mini series is rich in cinematography, tone and atmosphere – a mini movie. A companion podcast was released alongside the TV series. Highly recommend listening to the podcast alongside each of the episodes of the TV series. It gives more insight and history to moments you feel are unreal, plus behind the scenes details of how the series was created.

The Wife and the Widow by Christian White - Book

Nothing like a good page turner when its raining outside and this novel will not disappoint. Crime. Suspense. And a serious twist which I personally didn't see coming. The second novel from White, and it doesn't fall short to the expectations set by his first. Told from the perspective of two women, one shrouded in grief for her husband, and another who is confronted with evidence her husband is a murderer. A dark and eerie island setting, think Shetland but in an Australian context. Definitely deserving of all the awards it has taken out.





Cloudstreet by Tim Winton - Book

I was reminded of this Australian classic when chatting with a friend recently. This book will be forever etched into my memory, pouring over the pages in intimate detail in high school (shout out to Mrs Tiller). This book was the beginning of how I fell in love with beautifully written novels. Winton captures the life and times of two rural families who moved to Perth to start a new chapter in their lives. It captures the social, economic and news of the era from the 1940s to 1960s. Winton's ability to personify the house they call home is a literary triumph. This book has won the Miles Franklin Award - literary award for novels that best represent Australian life in all of its phases and shapes.

Eagles and Falcons swoop into the Central Wheatbelt for educational tour



The West Coast Eagles have travelled through the central Wheatbelt to run several educational programs in schools and junior football clubs

AFLW player Aimee Schmidt was joined by staff from the club's Community and Game Development team as well as the West Australian Football Commission and West Perth Football Club in an important regional visit across the Wheatbelt region. Education was on the agenda for the three day visit with programs such as Eagles Rock My School, Junior SOAR and Eagle Insight delivered to a number of school children while the popular Faction Footy got the kids moving.



Growing up in the Wheatbelt, Schmidt was ecstatic to head back to the region and provide some educational opportunities for the kids. "The trip was really good and it was a nice day out in Cunderdin. We ran some clinics with the kids at the primary school and then headed over to the footy club to run an Auskick clinic over there," she said. "Hopefully they can take a few things from us that we've taught them, and they can put it into their own footy and their own lifestyle." Schmidt said the reception from participants throughout the visit was extremely positive. "Those kids don't get to come to Perth very often so when they have people coming out to them I think they really appreciate it and they really enjoy it. When I was playing footy as a junior, I don't think I ever had people come out to us, it was always going out to Perth to do clinics and stuff like that so we never really had the same opportunity." "I think the

ability for us to go out there and have our presence out in the Wheatbelt is really big." The trip was a joint initiative between the club, the WAFC and West Perth to educate the region's youth, with the Wheatbelt being part of the Falcons WAFL talent zone"





Recommended Book



































Free Kick — First Week

With Commissioner for Consumer Protection Trish Blake Clearer pricing rules for funerals

There's nothing easy about losing a loved one, but we hope new WA laws will go a long way towards clearing up any confusion about what their final farewell will cost.

Funeral companies must now publicly display their prices upfront to give consumers the chance to compare costs without having to meet with a representative from the business to get this information. Consumers should now receive a full breakdown of prices and know exactly what the total cost of the funeral will be, so there are no surprises later on.

The new regulations in the Funeral Pricing Code of Practice stop sales practices that once made it difficult for consumers to make informed decisions at a very emotional time. In some previous cases, the final cost wasn't known until after the funeral was held, leading family and friends of the deceased to believe they had been overcharged.

Those consumers who decide to pay for their funerals upfront before they are needed should know they are protected by the mandatory <u>Prepaid Funerals Code of Practice</u>, which was introduced in 2021. The Code requires goods and services to be detailed in the contract, prices to be fixed at the time of signing, a 30-day cooling off period and payments to prepaid funeral funds to be managed within secure investments under the name of the client until they are required.

It's important to note that prepaid funeral cover is different to funeral insurance, which should be treated with caution given ongoing payments are required for the rest of a consumer's life — meaning they could pay significantly more than the actual payment their family will receive.

Funeral bonds bought through a funeral director, a friendly society or a life insurer are another way of saving for funeral expenses. After paying an initial deposit, regular payments are made over time and the money grows in value with interest. Money invested in this way can only be used for a funeral, meaning it can't be taken out earlier.

Ultimately we believe the simplest way to pay upfront for a funeral is to save up for it in a term deposit or savings account, separate to your everyday bank account.



King Neptune reigns

Atlantis Marine Park's slogan was "for the enrichment of mankind". Located in Two Rocks, Western Australia, it opened on Boxing Day, 1981. Touted as Seaworld meets Dreamworld, the much loved and controversial theme park was the vision of late WA businessman Alan Bond in partnership with Japan-based Tokyu Corporation. Atlantis was a part of the Sun City Precinct, which included a marina, yacht club, accommodation and shopping centre.

The park gates opened at 10 am, and more than 13 500 people visited in the first few days. Entrance to the park was \$6 for Adults, \$2.50 for Children, and \$3 for Pensioners. The theme park included performing dolphins, seal shows, water slides, aqua playgrounds, roller coasters, paddle boats, and a souvenir shop.

Crowds flocked to see dolphins perform breathtaking leaps and seals clowning around. In the Oceanarium, visitors could see a close-up view of fish, rays, turtles, and sharks.

For hungry tummies, the Jolly Roger offered mouthwatering takeaways. The Aloha Polynesian Smorgasbord served tropical delights, and the Challenger Restaurant offered a fine-wine list and a la carte menu.

A giant 10-metre-tall limestone statue of King Neptune, Roman God of the Sea, was built by artist Mark Le Buse along with other quirky, ocean-themed sculptures, including the disembodied head of Jacques Cousteau. King Neptune still stands as a beloved local landmark and was restored in 2022 for the local community.

Six months before the park opened, seven bottlenose dolphins were captured from the wild and trained as performance animals. They were the major drawcard to the theme park for the next ten years. Three calves were born in captivity.







Atlantis Marine Park closed in 1990 due to financial difficulty and changing legislation that would require the construction of significantly larger dolphin enclosures. The surrounding residential and commercial areas became abandoned.

A long project to rehabilitate the dolphins for release into the wild followed. Three of the nine dolphins were eventually re-homed at Underwater World aquarium (now AQWA) after failing to live successfully in the wild. Marine biologist Kelly Waples worked on the project team and documented her experience. Many lessons learnt are still applicable to marine mammal releases today.

In 1972, developers launched the Yanchep Sun City "leisure city" with the Two Rocks Marina to be built as a training base for the 1974 challenge for the America's Cup yacht race. Many of the streets in Two Rocks were named after yachts competing in America's Cup. The listing recognises the significant contribution the seaside precinct has made to our State's heritage as the first residential, commercial and recreational investment project undertaken by a private company in the 1970s.

Cunderdin's War Days



On occasions when my Sister Jo and I meet our conversation frequently turns to the great times we had in our teens. This is often with a feeling of guilt as all our young men, including our brother, were away at war. But circumstances dealt us a lucky hand in that the powers that were, decided to establish an air training station in Cunderdin. This meant that we had about a thousand men in the town and many of them were about our age.

With three other girls, being Ruby Chatfield, Addie Smart and Margaret Williams we organised weekly dances in the Town Hall on a Wednesday night. This was no easy task as we had to work up the floor fit for dancing. The hall was used for pictures on Saturday nights and we spent our half day off on Wednesday afternoon, sweeping and chipping off the chewing gum and then applied our special secret treatment to the dance floor. The first dance the floor was a bit sticking, how ever from then on you were battling to stand as it was so slippery.

With Mr Harold Smart (Chief Engineer on the pumping station) volunteering his services on the door, we would charge 1/- (ten cents) admission per head, with the band charging £2 for their refreshments, a few cold beers, the rest, around £7 to £10 was donated to the Cunderdin Patriotic Council who supplied personal comforts to our local men overseas.

There was no such thing as a "wallflower" in those days as there were about five boys to each girl. Needless to say a number of girls travelled from Meckering and Tammin for the dances. The music was provided by a band made up of airmen and as time went by we finished up with a band completely of officers. Chief Flying Instructor, Col Strickland played drums, Eric Ramsay - piano, Geoff Mourish -

saxophone and Paddy Maloney - violin. Looking back I think they found the music and the practicing a relaxation from instructing the young fellows how to fly.

We had great pleasure when invited to the Sergeants' or Officers' Mess's for a social and dance and a super supper. I have found an old invitation which maybe of interest. The training station also ran two or three bia balls each vear held in their large recreation hall, which was about three times the size of the Cunderdin hall. All the men on the base were allowed to attend and there were often bus loads of girls from Perth. These included the wives and the girl friends of the men stationed here.

Most of the girls had a mild romance at this time, some even found the man of their dreams and married an airman. It seemed a strange world when the station closed and we had to settle back to normal life.

PUMPKIN

SOUP

Ingredients

- 1.2 kg / 2.4 lb pumpkin (any type) OR butternut squash, unpeeled weight (Note 1)
- 1 onion, sliced (white, brown, yellow)
- 2 garlic cloves , peeled whole
- 3 cups (750ml) vegetable or chicken broth/stock, low sodium
- 1 cup (250 ml) water
- Salt and pepper

FINISHES:

☐1/2 - 3/4 cup (125 - 185 ml) cream , half and half or milk (Note 2)

Instructions

- Cut the pumpkin into 3cm / 2.25" slices. Cut the skin off and scrape seeds out (video is helpful). Cut into 4cm / 1.5" chunks.
- Place the pumpkin, onion, garlic, broth and water in a pot – liquid won't quite cover all the pumpkin. Bring to a boil, uncovered, then reduce heat and let simmer rapidly until pumpkin is tender (check with butter knife) – about 10 minutes.
- Remove from heat and use a stick blender to blend until smooth (Note 3 for blender).
- Season to taste with salt and pepper, stir through cream (never boil soup after adding cream, cream will split).
- Ladle soup into bowls, drizzle over a bit of cream, sprinkle with pepper and parsley if desired. Serve with crusty bread!



Plantar Fasciitis (planar heel pain) is a common condition that causes pain under the heel of the foot, and may extend into the arch area.




