History of Cunderdin

The search for pastoral lands east of Perth led explorer Charles Hunt to many towns in today's Wheatbelt, including Cunderdin - a town he named in 1864. Derived from the Njungyar Aboriginal language it is said to mean 'place of the bandicoot' but according to another source translates as 'place of many flowers'. The later is certainly true in the springtime when Cunderdin Hill - which overlooks the town - is carpeted with pink and yellow everlasting and yellow cascades of wattle.

Settlement in Cunderdin by Europeans started to progress following the building of the railway in 1884. Charles Hillman undertook the first farmlet in 1898 and by 1901 - thanks to the construction of the Goldfields Water Supply - more people ventured into the area. By 1902 Cunderdin boasted a small general store, a restaurant, hotel (also a receiving house for mail) and a school which was built by Charles Hillman.

In 1903 when the pipeline to Kalgoorlie was completed,



the No 3 Pumping Station in Cunderdin was opened. This fine and imposing building, which housed

the powerful steam engines responsible for sending the water down the line, still stands today and is home to the impressive Cunderdin Museum.

By 1906 Cunderdin was officially declared a townsite. There were 22 farms in the district - most of them spread south of the railway line from Youndegin - the earliest settlement in the area, some 19 kilometres away.

Thanks to an excellent rail service and an assured water supply (through the pipeline) the next three decades were periods of rapid development with farms expanding in every direction. Services in Cunderdin continued to expand and during the 1920s a Cottage Hospital - with resident doctor - was established.

The Cunderdin Airstrip was built early in the Second World War - designed as a bomber and RAAF flying school base. By 1941 the Elementary Flying Training School - as it was known - was at considerable strength with 34 officers, 500 airmen and 51 aircraft. Following the Second World War the No 9 Elementary Flying Training School was disbanded and the area was used as an Operational Base Unit, also disbanded in 1947. The school facilities were later used for a short time as a staging point for some 1000 displaced persons eventually sent on to Northam and other areas.

In 1945 the people of Cunderdin bought the local hotel making it the first community-owned hotel in Western Australia. Debentures were issued for the purchase price and investors received a fixed dividend with the balance being used for community and recreational projects.

In 1948 a new Junior High School was opened and an Agricultural wing was added later - taking over the facilities

previously used by the Flying School. The wings' modern buildings, expertly planned instructional facilities and delightful gardens made it quite a showpiece.



In 1950 the Road Board resumed 27 hectares of farmland bordering the townsite to develop a Greater Sportsground and Sporting Complex with first class facilities for many sporting activities. The building of the Memorial Swimming Pool in the mid 1950s set the standard for surrounding areas as it was the first rural swimming pool for many hundreds of kilometres.

During 1956 the No 3 Pumping Station upgraded to electric power. A workshop was started to carry out repair work for all the pumping facilities.

In 1968 the landmark community-owned Hotel venture ended quite suddenly when a disastrous earthquake struck in the nearby town of Meckering



causing irreparable damage to the building. The property was subsequently sold to the Swan Brewery which built a modern, sophisticated hotel-motel on the original site. That hotel was later destroyed by fire in 2000 and replaced with the current Ettamogah Hotel.

Today, the town of Cunderdin is a thriving Wheatbelt community with a large range of services, business and sporting and community organisations. While agriculture still plays a major role in the town's success, other industries are developing thanks to the town's proximity to Perth and the size and quality of the Cunderdin Airstrip.



History Of Meckering

The township of Meckering – like so many Western Australian towns – derives its name from an Aboriginal language and means ‘place of water’ or ‘moon on water’ depending upon the translation. It is apt that ‘water’ is present in the Meckering’s name as it was precisely this substance that led to its’ discovery and early settlement.

Originally known as Beebering, the name Meckering was chosen by explorer, John Forrest with the official declaration of the townsite taking place on 17th February 1887.

Many decades earlier, in 1849, the first block of land – situated some 7kms south of Meckering near the rare and valuable well supplying good water - had been granted and was known as ‘Koolbunine’. Due to a lack of constant rainfall and surface water the area was not considered adequate for agricultural purposes until about 40 years later.

The first settlement was made in 1887 about 3kms north of Beebering Hill but it was not until April 1889 that the surrounding land was declared an agricultural area.



The rail link to Kalgoorlie reached Meckering in 1892 and within six years the town was home to a railway station,

three stores, a blacksmith, a hotel, a town hall, school, WA and Union banks and a post office. In addition, the office for local government administering the area as far east as Merredin was located in Meckering and remained there until 1920 when it was moved to Cunderdin.

Following the official declaration of the township in 1887 the school expanded and in 1898 the roll showed there were 60 children. Some pupils travelled by rail from as far as Doodlakine - 80 kms away.

The Goldfields Water Supply became available by 1901, supplying water to local residents. The 1903 a local cordial factory opened for business and continued to operate until 1950 supplying cool drinks across the entire state. From 1916 to 1958 power was supplied by a local plant, until the introduction of SEC power which further modernised the town.

From 1904 Meckering enjoyed the services of a local doctor and in 1920 a hospital was opened to cater for the surrounding areas. Both these services continued to operate until the



closure of the hospital in 1939. Bulk handling of grain began in 1933 when an installation was built – a far cry from the modern structure evident today.

Meckering Earthquake - 40 Seconds That Changed A Town

Until the 14th October 1968, Meckering’s residents were experiencing typical small country town life. But at 10.59am the fate and the future of the town changed dramatically when in only 40 seconds WA’s most significant earthquake devastated the town. Registering



6.9 on the Richter Scale, the quake’s epicentre was almost directly below Meckering and caused a stretch of ground more than 40kms long to rupture. It was so strong that residents in Albany, Esperance and

Perth reported damage.

For the town of Meckering the impact of the quake was devastating with more than 50 homes destroyed and shops, churches, buildings, sheds and water supplies ruined. Seventeen people were injured – some seriously – but amazingly no one was killed. Luckily it was a public holiday and the school and local shops were closed. Major roads fractured, telephone and power connections cut and the damage bill reached \$1.5 million (somewhere in the vicinity of \$5 million in today’s climate).

The Mundaring to Kalgoorlie Pipeline was severely damaged – a section of it has been preserved and can be viewed in Meckering at the Gazebo in Gabbedy Place. There is also an excellent display of photographs, statistics and information on the earthquake as well as a salvaged section of the damaged railway line. Even today there is still a one-kilometre stretch of the faultline visible – 12kms south of the town on the York to Meckering Road (click here for directions) and you may also like to visit the farm ruins at ‘Salisbury’ - an old stone wall homestead (built in 1904) wrecked in the quake.



Reconstruction of the town began soon after the quake but to the south west of the original site. Many fine new buildings were constructed including a Town Hall, Infant Health Clinic, shopping precinct, Inter-denominational Church, an air-conditioned Primary School and a Sporting Club.

The rebuilding of the town is a tribute to the community spirit of the residents and is physical evidence of the continuing pioneering attitude that originally enabled the area to be settled.

- Liquid Paperboard - Milk, juice and laundry detergent cartons.

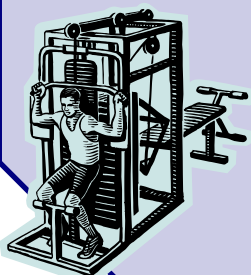

Household Rubbish

General household rubbish is collected from the kerbside each Monday morning. Bins need to be put out on Sunday night to ensure you don’t miss the collection service. Bins belong to individual residences and replacement bins are charged to the owner/occupier.

Recycling

The importance of recycling is now well known and by becoming more aware and vigilant we can all have a major positive impact on our environment. The more items we can avoid sending to landfill the better off our community will be socially, financially, and environmentally.

The Shire of Cunderdin provides a monthly kerbside recycling service through Clean Away Waste Management Services. The recycling service is available on the third Monday of every month. You can recycle the following items through your yellow recycling wheelie bin:

- Clean glass Bottles and Jars (lids removed)
- Aluminium and steel cans, tins and clean foil
- Empty plastic bottles and containers with 1,2 or 3 printed on the bottom (lids removed)
- Clean, untied newspapers, paper, magazines, telephone books
- Clean, flattened cardboard boxes and cartons
- Milk, juice, laundry and detergent cartons

The following items can NOT be placed in your yellow recycling bin

- Green waste
- Food scraps
- Polystyrene
- Plastic bags
- Nappies/Sanitary items

- Appliances
- Tools
- Lawn clippings
- Liquids
- Toys
- Clothing

Please note that all recycling must be placed loose in your recycling bin – please do not place any plastic bags in your bin.

You can take other household, garden and hazardous recyclable items to the transfer stations at Cunderdin and Meckering including:

- Small Branches
- Twigs
- Garden Prunings
- Small Timber Offcuts
- Untreated Timber

Please contact the Shire of Cunderdin if you are unsure about what other materials may be able to be accepted at the Transfer Stations.

Animal Control

The Ranger

The Shire's Ranger Services are provided by WA CONTRACT RANGER SERVICES -

Mathew Sharpe on 0459678154.

The Ranger is responsible for:

- Dog Complaints.
- Cat Complaints.
- Straying stock on roads. The Ranger continually monitors fences along roads and will issue notices to repair where necessary.
- Litter control.
- Off Road Vehicles.

(Fees and charges are subject to change without prior notice).

Pensioners are entitled to a 50% concession on fees and working dogs are given a 75% discount.

If there are changes to your Dog Registration (i.e. change

of address, dog passes away or is sold) the owner must notify the Shire as soon as possible.

It is the responsibility of dog owners to keep their dogs under control at all times. Wandering dogs present a nuisance and danger to the general public. The Shire Ranger responds to any complaints and carries out regular dog patrols. There are heavy penalties for owners who dogs have to be impounded.

Under the Dog Act 1976 all dog owners are required by law to:

- Register their dog with local council – unregistered dogs is an offence that carries a \$200 penalty
 - Ensure their dog is unable to escape from their yard
- Leash their dog at all times in public places
